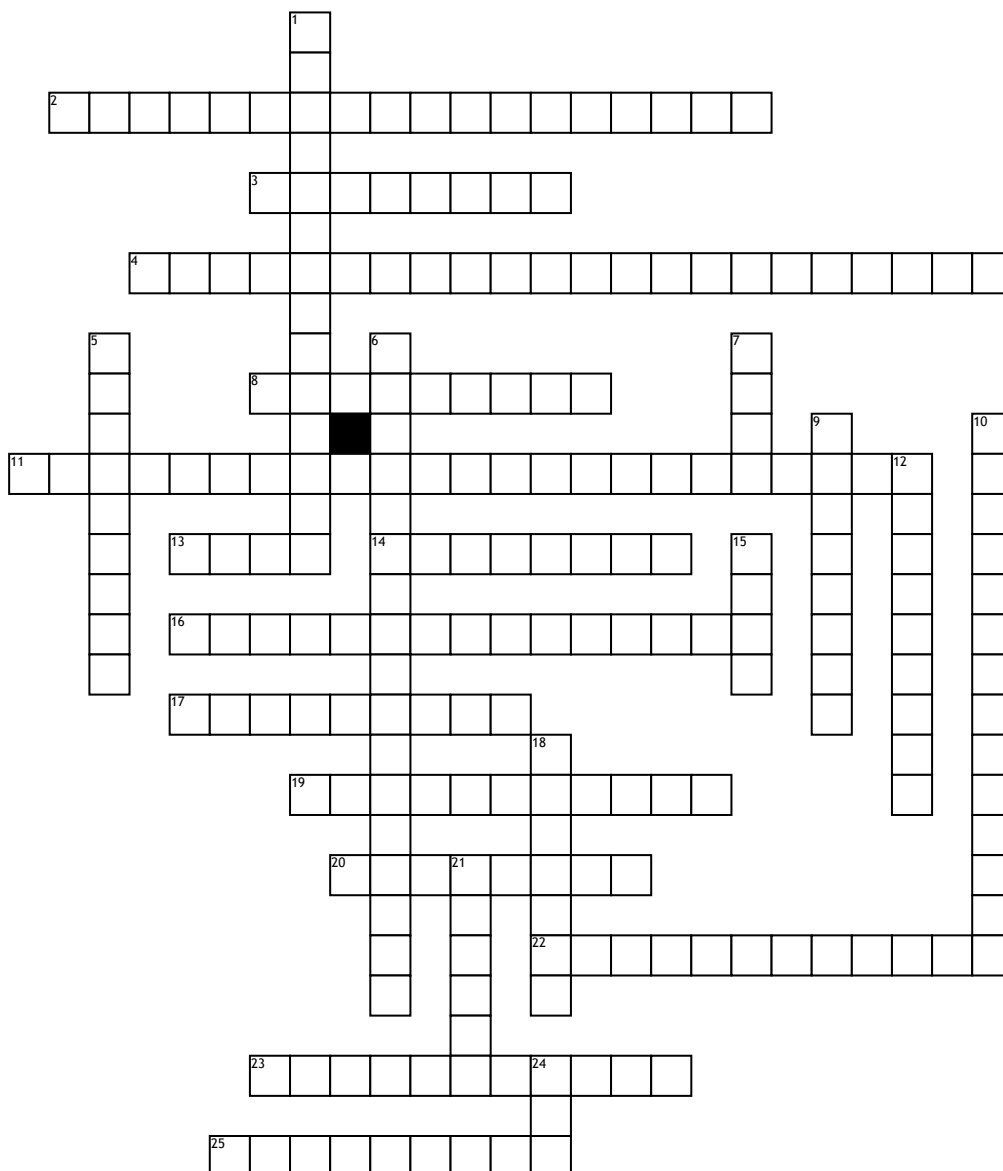


# 1.01 Puzzle

2. Given by specialists to restore or improve function after an illness or injury.
