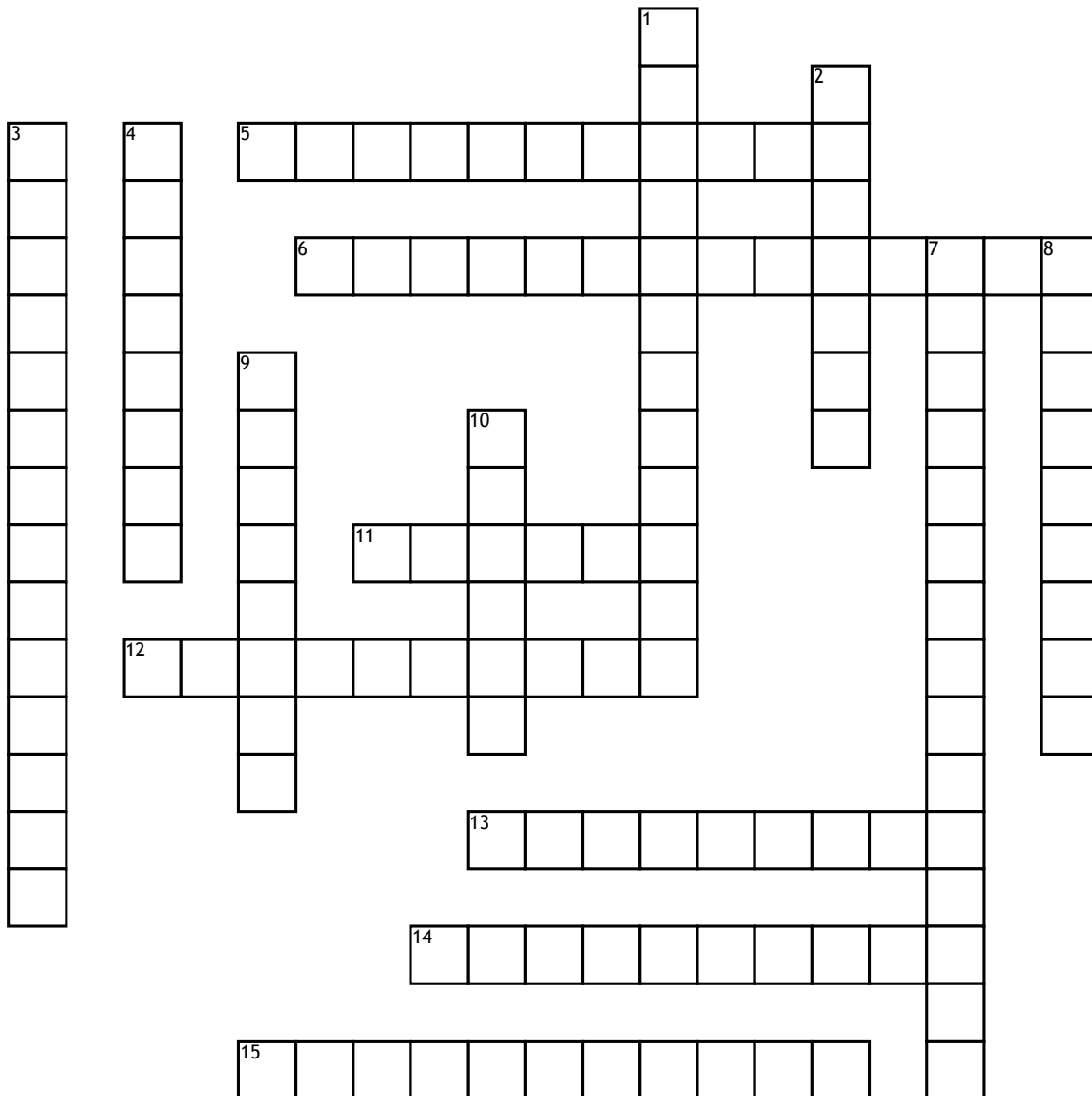

13. an instrument for measuring the extent and characteristics of a person's field of vision.

14. diagnose and treat conditions of the foot, ankle, and related structures of the leg.

15. a low dose x-ray exam of the breast ducts. The breast ducts are tubes that carry milk from the lobules to the nipple. This test may also be called galactography, sometimes confused with ductal lavage.

1. a medical condition in which the bones become brittle and fragile from loss of tissue, typically as a result of hormonal changes, or deficiency of calcium or vitamin D.

2. A cancer of plasma cells.

3. A type of arthritis that occurs when flexible tissue at the ends of bones wears down.

4. capable of bending easily without breaking.

7. An inflammation of the cartilage that connects a rib to the breastbone.

8. painful inflammation and stiffness of the joints

9. Inflammation of the fluid-filled pads (bursae) that act as cushions at the joints.

10. relating to the bones forming the human carpus (wrist), or to their equivalent in an animal's forelimb.
