

1. abnormal enlargement of the heart

6. two-headed muscle that lies on the upper arm between the shoulder and the elbow

9. having equal tension; denoting solutions possessing the same osmotic pressure

13. any of several muscles having three points of attachment at one end, like the triceps brachii

14. waste away (of body tissue away or an organ), typically due to the body degeneration of cells,

15. pertaining to or characterised by an increased tonicity or tension
