
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## 13 Colonies

- **6.** First colony founded in 1620 for religious freedom of the seperatists by William Bradford
- **10.** Founed in 1631 by the Dutch. William Penn was granted the Western shore of this colony
- **11.** Founed by James Oglethorpe and was set aside strictly for military use
- **12.** A time where reason, education, and tolerance were encouraged

- **14.** The Indian woman who helped Jamestown become successful by teaching the colonists how to grow tobacco
- **15.** This colony was settled by John Smith on a marsh which brought disease and famine later on **Down**
- 1. These people tipped their hat to no man, were immune from miliatary involvement, and were very egalitarian
- **2.** The Protestant sect in England hoping to "purify" the Anglican church
- **3.** founded in 1681 by William Penn

- **5.** Founded in 1636 by Thomas Hooker in order to escape the overcrowding of Massachusetts
- **7.** This colony was founded in 1634 by Lord Baltimore
- **8.** People who were a form of puritans who wanted to completely break away from the Anglican church of England
- **9.** Preached values of simple worship, strict morals, predestination, and hard work
- **13.** This crop became known as the crop that saved Jamestown and allowed it to be the wealthiest colony to exist
