

- 2. political party founded in western Canada; opposed to capitalism
- 7. discrimination or hostility toward Jewish people
- 9. nationalist French Canadian political party led by Maurice Duplessis
- 15. Canada's first socialist party founded in the Prairies in 1932; advocated government control of the economy
- 17. compensation from a defeated enemy for damages caused by war
- 19. report of the Royal Commission on Dominion-Provincial Relations, a commission set up in 1937 to examine the Canadian economy & federal-provincial relations
- 24. a series of programs, such as social assistance for the aged & unemployed, introduced by US president Roosevelt in the 1930s to deal with the Depression
- 27. a government in which the ruling party has more seats in the House of Commons than all other parties combined
- 28. October 29, 1929, when the New York Stock Exchange collapsed
- 29. an economic condition in which industry is free of government intervention
- 30. a system of using tariffs to raise the price of imported goods in order to protect domestic producers

- 31. buying shares "on margin" with the expectation that the value of the shares will increase enough to pay back the loan & make a profit
 - 32. a long period of severe economic & social hardship & massive unemployment & suffering
 - 33. a 1935 rail trip from Vancouver to Ottawa by unemployed men to protest conditions at employment relief camps

- 1. the formation of labour unions
 - 3. a federal transfer of funds from richer to poorer provinces
 - 4. more goods being produced than being sold; leads to a decrease in production which leads to increased unemployment
 - 5. an economic system in which both individuals & the government produces & sells goods
 - 6. platform of the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation party; it supported public ownership of industry & social programs to assist those in need
 - 8. a movement advocating for the protection & development of Quebecois culture & language
 - 10. an economic system in which individuals produce goods & prices are determined by supply & demand
 - 11. in the economic cycle; the period of economic growth & expansion
 - 12. taxes on imported goods

- 13. an economic system in which the production & distribution of goods are owned privately or by shareholders in corporations who have invested their money in the hope of making a profit
- 14. an unemployed person who moves from place to place in search of work
- 16. in the economic cycle; the period following a recession during which the value of goods & services rises
- 18. the quantity of a product that is available and the market's desire for that product; makes the price of a product fluctuate

- 23. a state in which the government actively looks after the well-being of citizens
- 24. relief payments by a government, sometimes in the form of vouchers for food & other essentials
