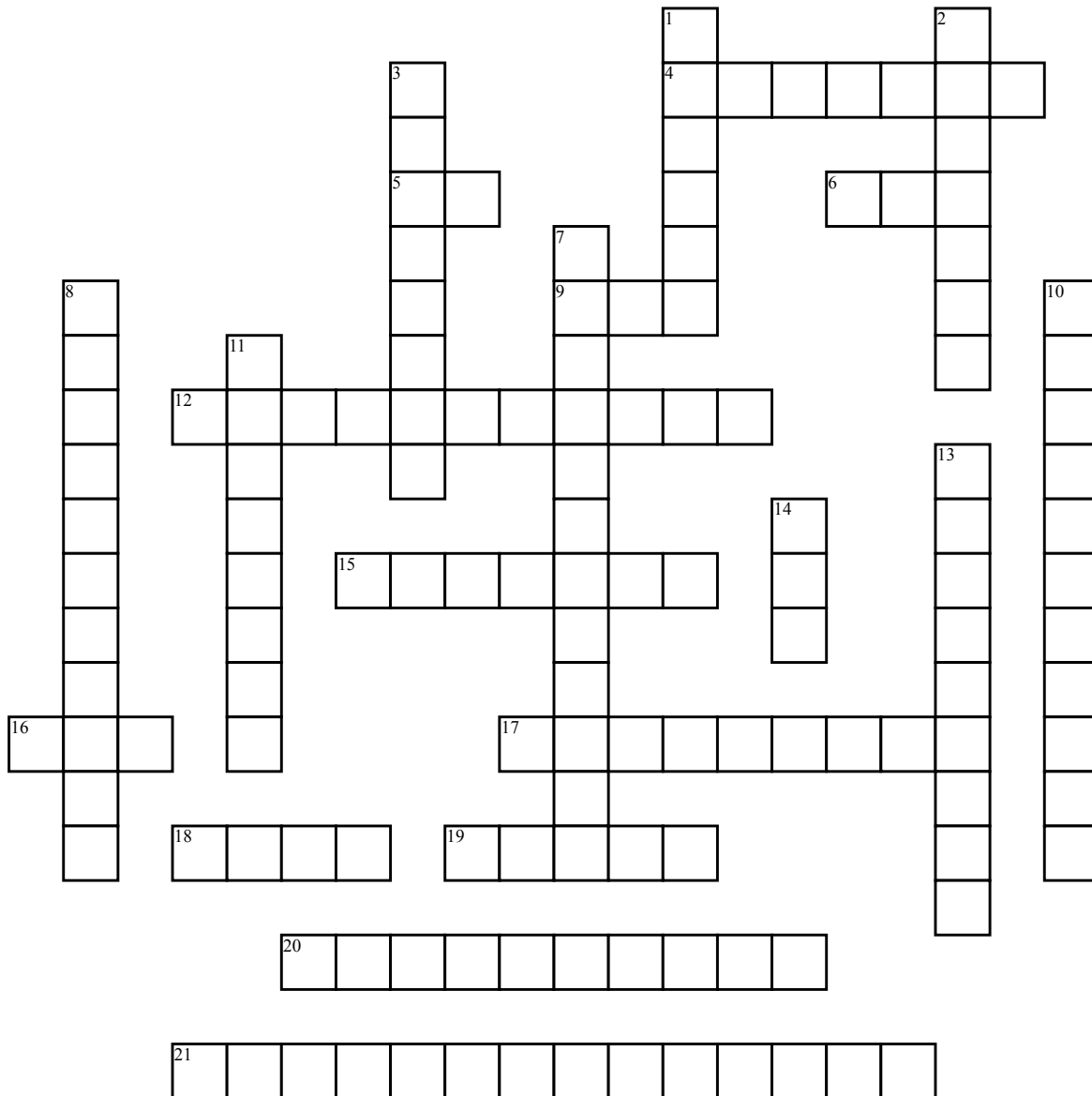

4. A computer-created drawing or painting.
5. A proprietary graphic format developed by Adobe Systems based on the older EPS format for storing vector-based graphics. Short for Adobe Illustrator.
6. An uncompressed raster graphic format with support for 256 colors but without support for animation or transparency. Short for Bitmap.
9. A container file format for storing vector-based graphics coded in the PostScript programming language. Short for Encapsulated PostScript. Same as EPSF and EPSI.
12. An image compression method in which an initial pixelated image is loaded that becomes clearer as the image finishes loading. Same as Progressive Compression.
15. Premade graphics without copyright restrictions that are included with many software packages or available online.

16. A raster graphic format commonly found online with support for 256 colors and transparency. Can display simple animations when viewed. Short for Graphic Interchange Format.

17. A professional-grade image design and graphic editor that popularized the PNG image file format. Developed by Macromedia (now part of Adobe).

18. A free professional-grade image design and graphic editor.

19. The type of compression in which some data is lost or sacrificed - usually to gain the benefit of a reduced file size.

20. The number of colors that can be displayed in an image.

21. Computer software for editing and formatting visual media commonly referred to as clip art, graphics, images, pictures, or photographs.

1. rea behind text or objects. Can be colored or textured. Same as Background.

2. Digital artwork. Same as Image and Picture. Includes Clip Art, Illustrations, and Photographs.

3. An image compression method in which a clear image is revealed from the top down. Same as Baseline Compression.

7. Graphic formats that can contain both vector and raster graphics data. Formats include: PNG

8. Process for reducing file size. A compressed image can be copied or moved faster and easier. The trade off is a loss of speed during viewing.

10. Raster images of real-life scenes that contain millions of colors.

11. A free vector graphics editor developed to implement full support for the Scalable Vector Graphics (SVG) standard.

13. A professional-grade image design and graphic editor. Developed by Adobe.

14. A proprietary graphic format developed by Autodesk, Inc. for sharing graphical data between their AutoCAD software and other programs. Short for Drawing Exchange Format.
