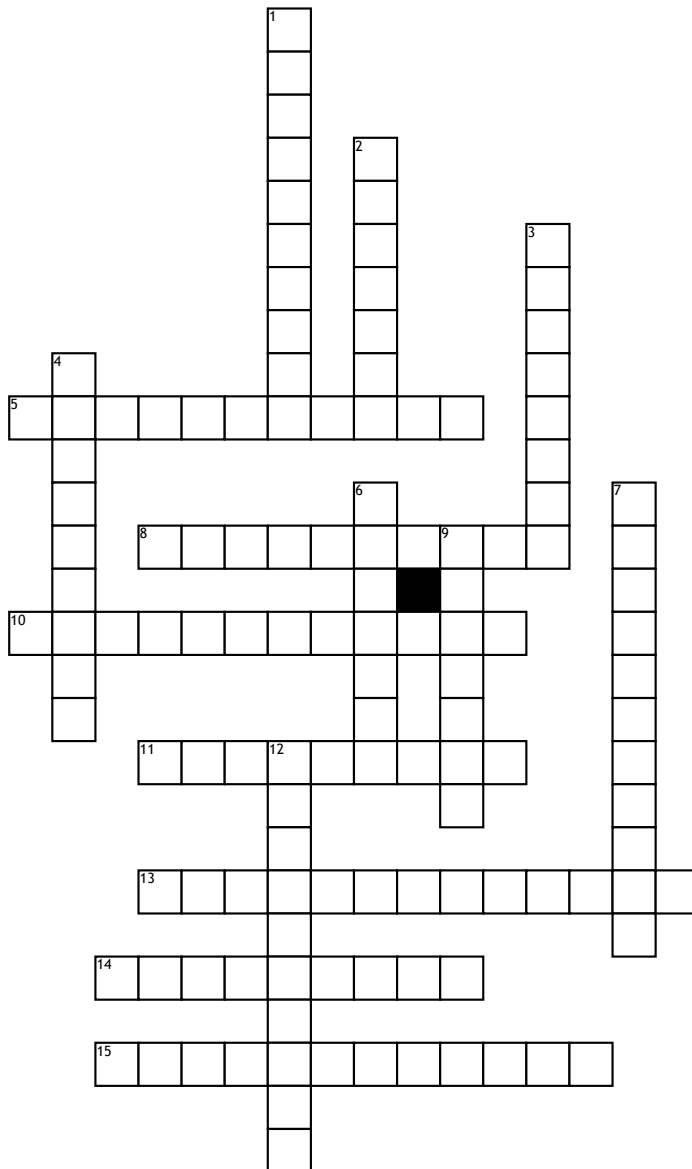

5. an involuntary contraction of a muscle that can cause a great deal of pain

8. excess drainage, ranging from a clear fluid to thick mucus, from the nose and nasal passage

10. an examination that lets your doctor look at the back of your throat, your voice box (larynx), and vocal cords with a scope

11. oozing of blood from the nose

13. a procedure in which a needle is inserted into the pleural space between the lungs and the chest wall

14. inflammation of one or both lungs, with dense areas of lung inflammation

15. an apparatus used for recording and measuring spectra, especially as a method of analysis

1. inflammation of the lining of bronchial tubes, which carry air to and from the lungs

2. difficult or labored breathing

3. a condition in which feces are discharged from the bowels frequently and in a liquid form

4. relating to the lungs

6. a large membranous tube reinforced by rings of cartilage, extending from the larynx to the bronchial tubes and conveying air to and from the lungs; the windpipe.

7. Vibration of both the ventricular folds and the vocal folds, producing two simultaneous voice tone

9. a lower-than-normal concentration of oxygen in arterial blood,

12. a common office test used to assess how well your lungs work by measuring how much air you inhale
