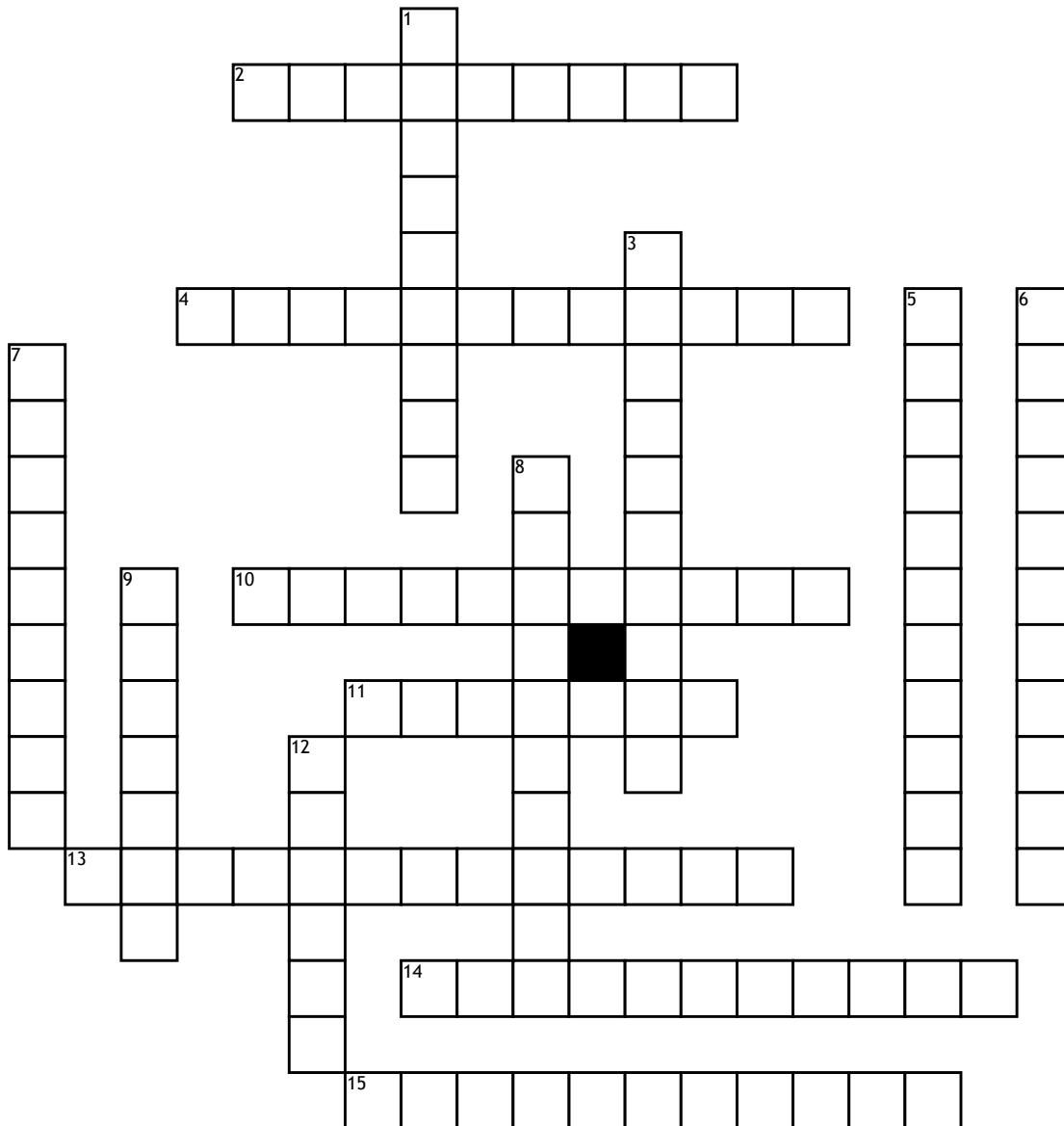

2. Infection that inflames air sacs in one or both lungs, which may fill with fluid

4. brief spasm of the vocal cords that temporarily makes it difficult to speak or breathe

10. instrument for measuring and indicating temperature, typically one consisting of a narrow, hermetically sealed glass tube marked with graduations and having at one end a bulb containing mercury or alcohol that expands and contracts in the tube with heating and cooling.

11. large membranous tube reinforced by rings of cartilage, extending from the larynx to the bronchial tubes and conveying air to and from the lungs; the windpipe.

13. removal of fluid from the abdomen by centesis

14. oozing of blood from the mucous membrane into the bladder.

15. Spasms of skeletal muscles are most common and are often due to overuse and muscle fatigue, dehydration, and electrolyte abnormalities
