

- 8. The portion of the economy concerned with manufacturing useful products through processing, transforming, and assembling raw materials.
- 10. Foods that\have their genes altered in a laboratory for specific purposes, such as disease resistant, increased productivity, or nutrients value
- 11. The cultivation of seafood under controlled conditions
- 12. An outgrowth of the 3rd agricultural revolution, this effort began in the 1940s and developed new strains of hybrid seeds and fertilizers that dramatically increased the crop output possible from each farm.
- 14. The portion of the economy concerned with the direct extraction of materials from Earth's surface, generally through agriculture, although sometimes by mining, fishing, and forestry.
