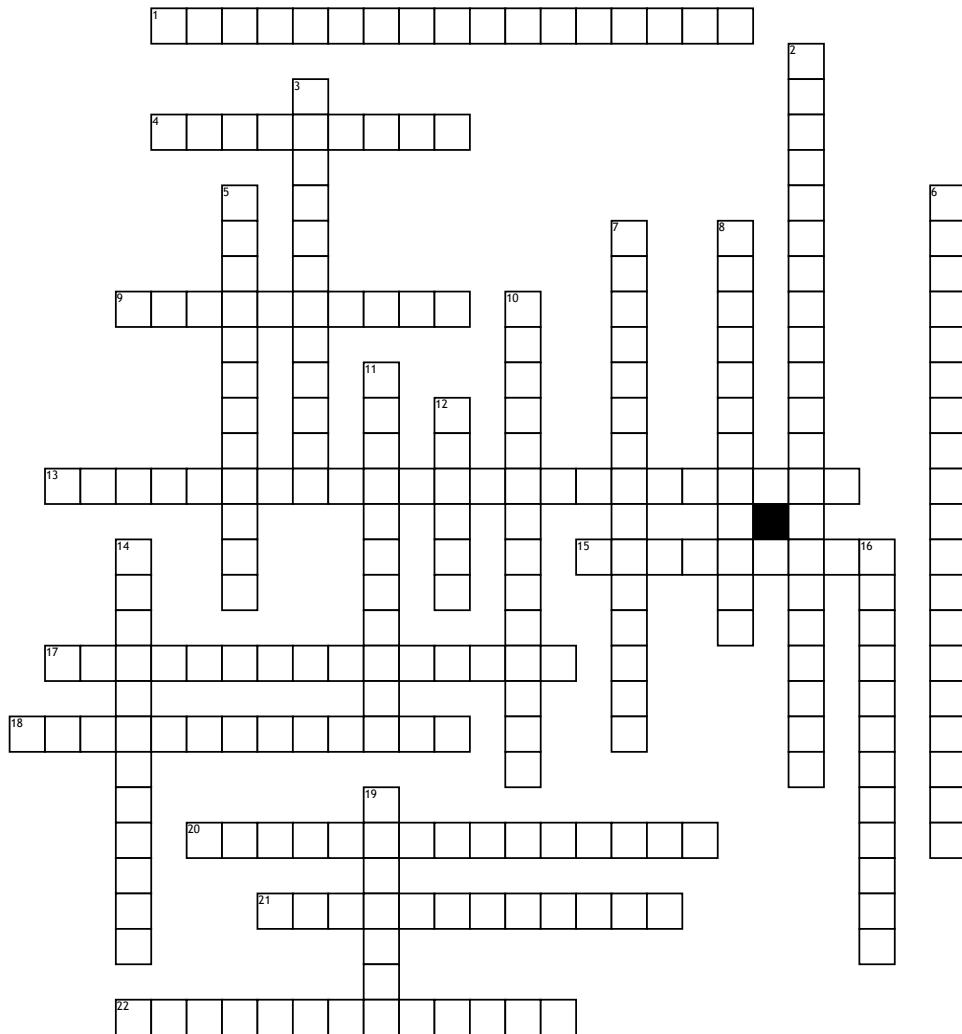


# Abdominal, Hematologic, Gynecological, Genitourinary, Renal Emergencies

1. Bulging, engorgement, or weakening of the blood vessels in the lining of the lower part of the esophagus.  
 4. A special fluid used for dialysis.  
 9. The studies of the female reproductive system.  
 13. A weakened, ballooned, and enlarged area of the wall of the abdominal aorta.  
 15. Blood in the urine.  
 17. A position generally assumed by patients with acute abdominal pain with knees drawn up and hands clenched over the abdomen.  
 18. The condition in which endometrial tissue grows outside the uterus.

20. The space located below the diaphragm that extends to the top of the pelvis.

21. Organs that contain a substance that might leak into the abdominal cavity if the organ is perforated or injured.

22. Inflammation of the gallbladder.

2. Blockage that interrupts the normal flow of the intestinal contents.  
 3. Severe pain or cramps during menstruation.  
 5. Inflammation of the appendix.  
 6. Male organ system that includes both the reproductive and the urinary structures.  
 7. Inflammation of the stomach and small intestine.

8. Inflammation of the endometrium.

10. The portion of the descending aorta that divides into the iliac arteries, arteries branching from the abdominal aorta supply the abdominal organs.

11. Vomiting of blood

12. Protrusion or thrusting forward of a portion of the intestine through an opening or weakness in the abdominal wall.

14. Bright red blood in the stool.

16. A sharp, severe abdominal pain with rapid onset.

19. An artificial process used to remove water and waste substances from the blood when the kidneys fail to function properly.
