| 3. A mechanical process (scrubbing) using soap and water or detergent and water to remove all visible dirt, debris, and many disease-causing germs. | C. Sodium hypochlorite |
| 4. Commonly known as "quats" are products made of quaternary ammonium cations and are designed for disinfection on nonporous surfaces. | D. Pathogenic disease |
| 5. Also known as communicable disease, that is spread from one person to another person. | E. Contagious disease |
| 6. Disease-causing microorganism carried in the body by blood or body fluids, such as hepatitis and HIV. | F. Nonpathogenic |
| 7. A fungal infection of the scalp characterized by red papules, or spots, at the opening of the hair follicles. | G. Quaternary ammonium compounds |
| 8. Common household bleach; an effective disinfectant for the salon. | H. Diplococci |
| 9. Disease produced by organisms, including bacteria, viruses, fungi, and parasites | I. Cleaning |
