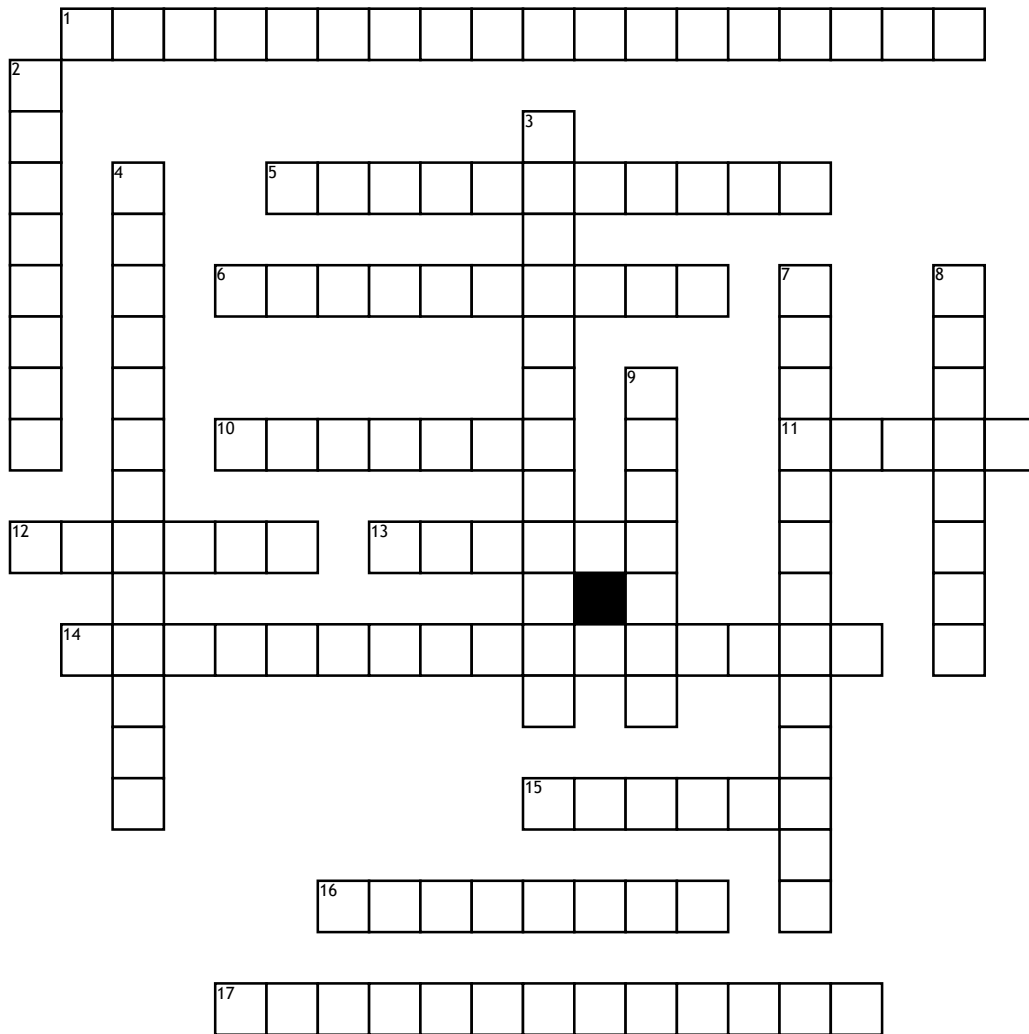


# Acts Leading to Increase Tensions
