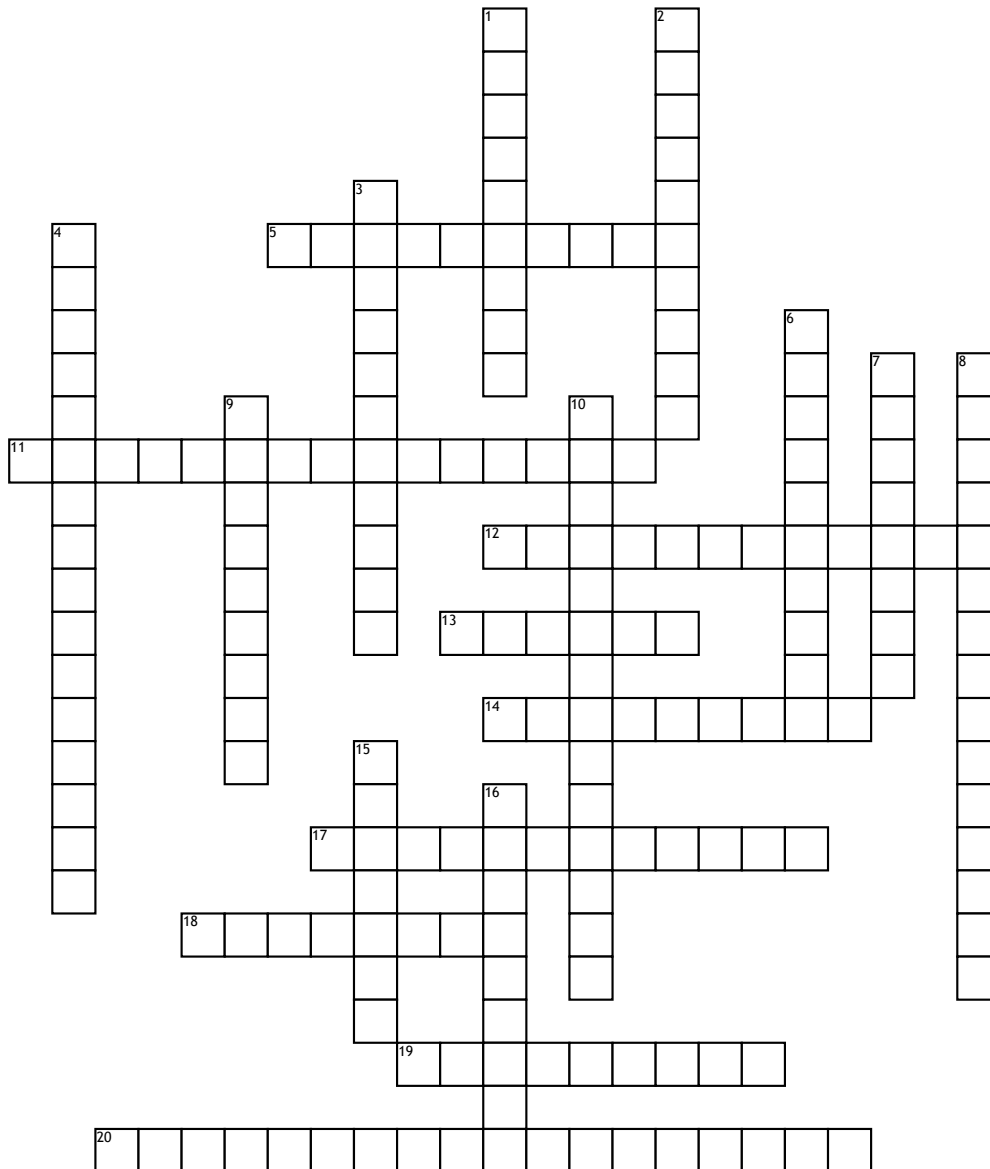


Adult and Juvenile Justice

 17. Highest court in GA; has no jury and only hears cases on appeal

1. Dispute between 2 people
 2. The charge given to a defendant by a grand jury; this means there is enough evidence for the case to progress to a trial court
 3. A minor crime; less than a year in prison and less than a \$1000 fine

4. repeat juvenile offenders or those who are a danger to the community; can be imprisoned up to 5 years

6. The lawyer who represents the state in a trial

7. A case in which a law has been broken

8. Lawyer who represents the defendant

9. The person who brings the lawsuit

10. Courts that only hear cases on appeal; no jury
