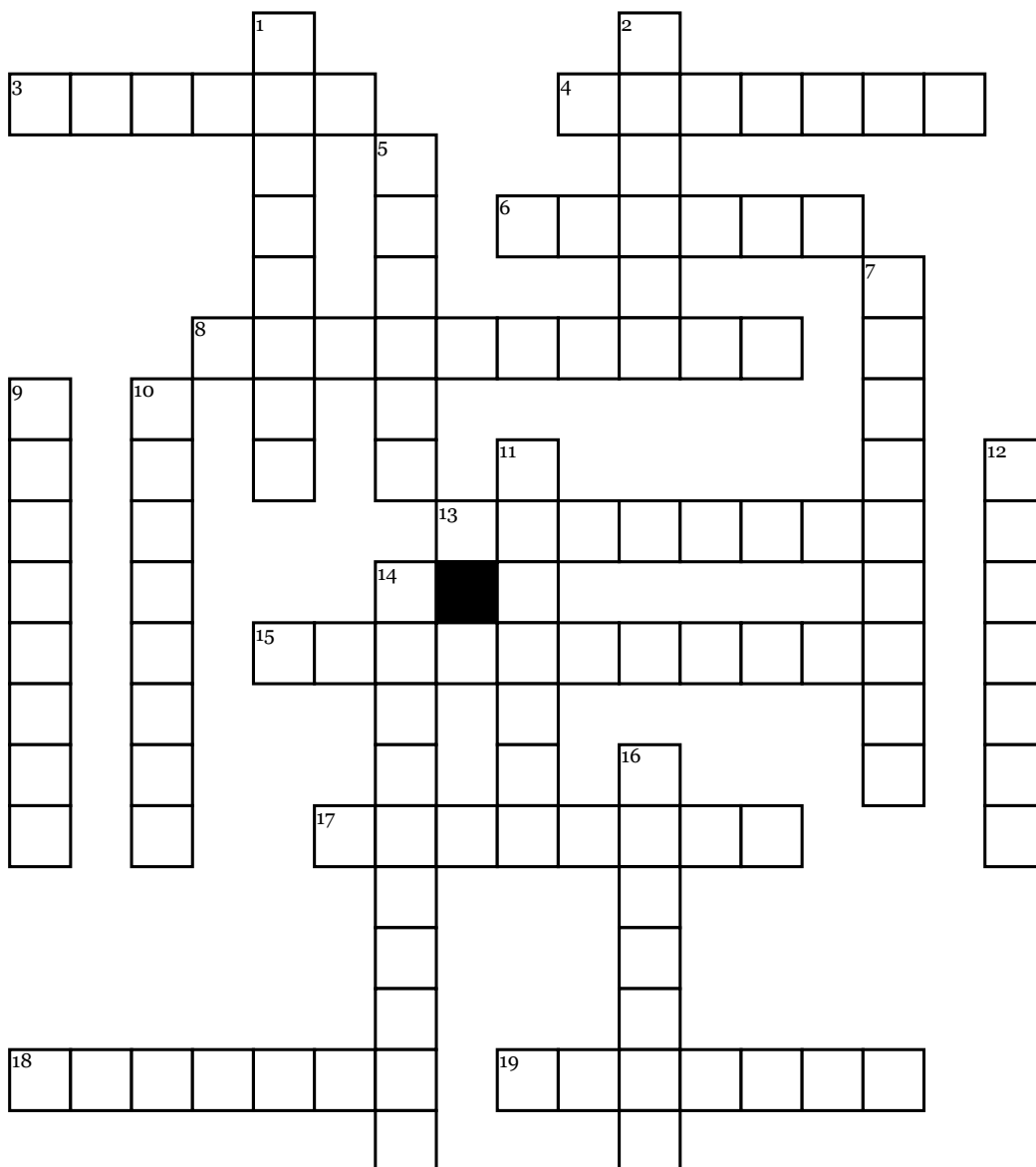


All Around Towns
