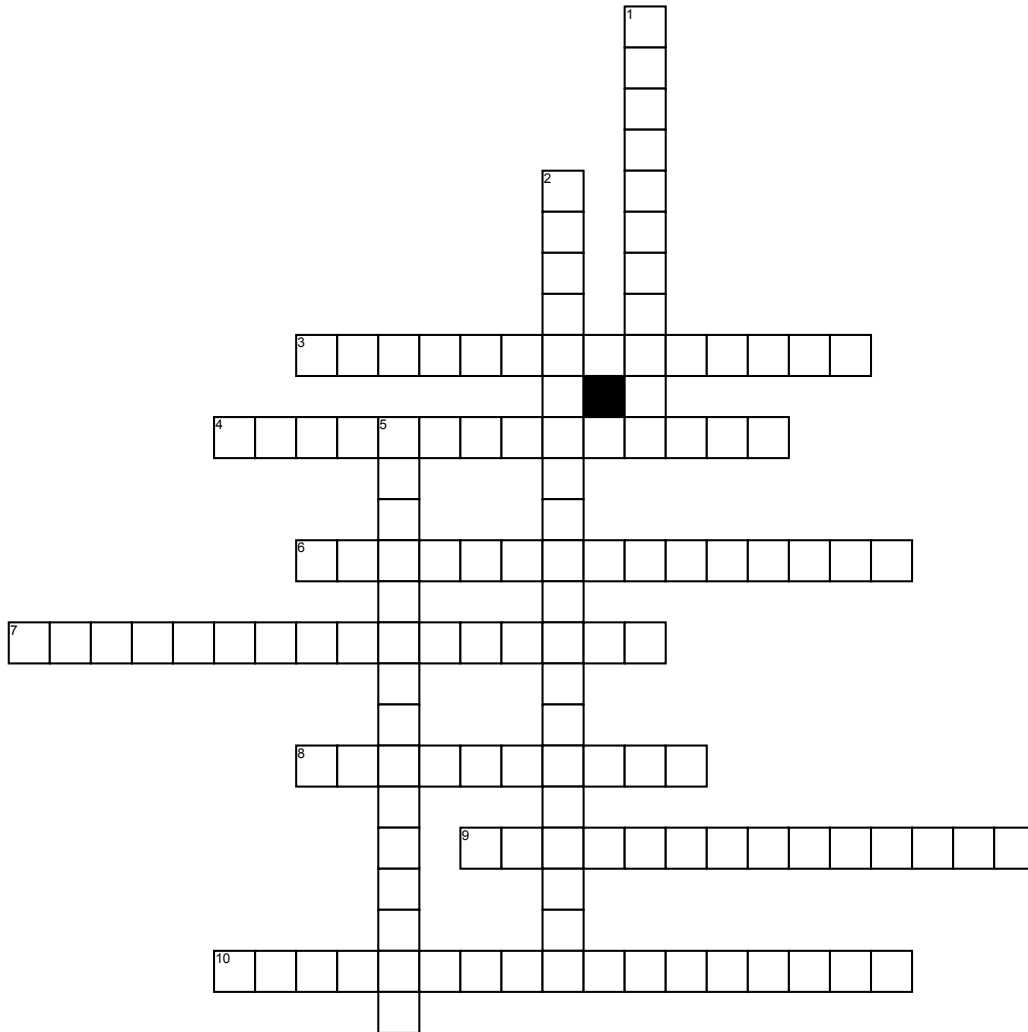

- 3. avoiding involvement in the affairs of their countries
- 4. this policy stated that all nations should have equal access to trade in China
- 6. stated the United States had no interest in taking control of Cuba
- 7. to attract readers, Pulitzer and Hearst printed sensational, often exaggerated news stories
- 8. building an empire by founding colonies or conquering other nations

- 9. limited Cuba's right to make treaties and allowed the United States to intervene in Cuban affairs

- 10. a long, violent struggle for power in Mexico

- 2. a group that opposed the treaty and the creation of an American Colonial Empire
- 5. influencing governments through economic, not military, intervention
