

- 12. site of Ancient Chinese civilization. Also called the Yellow River or River of Sorrows.
- 13. Social order, harmony, and good government could be restored in China if society were organized around 5 basic relationships: ruler-subject, father-son, husband-wife, older brother-younger brother, friend-friend.

1. Chinese philosophy developed by Hanfeizi; taught that humans are naturally evil and therefore need to be ruled by harsh laws

- 2. Brutal, local ruler from the Chinese state of Qin
- 3. Chinese philosopher; founder of Taoism
- 4. 8,000 clay larger-than-life soldiers to accompany Qin to the next world
- 5. vast desert in the Northern part of China which created a barrier to isolate the Chinese from interactions with the people in the North.

- 9. founder of legalism and believed that harsh punishments were the only way to control people
