
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Anesthesia Drugs

- 4. most potent opioid
- **10.** Benzodiazepine similar in action to diazepam but can be given IM or IV
- 12. Most commonly used to maintain anesthesia after administration of an injectable induction agent, but can also be used to induce anesthesia
- 13. partial mu agonist
- **14.** Preferred agent to counteract vagually-induced bradycardia
- **15.** strong sedative with antiemetic effect

- **17.** Hypnotic sedative-probably effets release of endogenous GABA, an inhibitory neurotransmitter
- **18.** Primarily used as an induction agent or to preform a short procedure with little pain involved

Down

- 1. common fluid type used in surgery
- 2. 8-10x more potent then morphine
- **3.** alpha-2 adrenoreceptor agonists

- **5.** Fast acting injectable agent without cumulative effect, rapid induction and recovery
- **6.** similar to ketamine and sold only in combination with zolazepam
- 7. a state of inconsolability
- **8.** alpha-2 antagonist used as a reversal agent for medetomidine
- **9.** Pure mu agonist, potent analgesia and sedation
- 11. mixed agonist/antagonist
- **16.** MU antagonist
