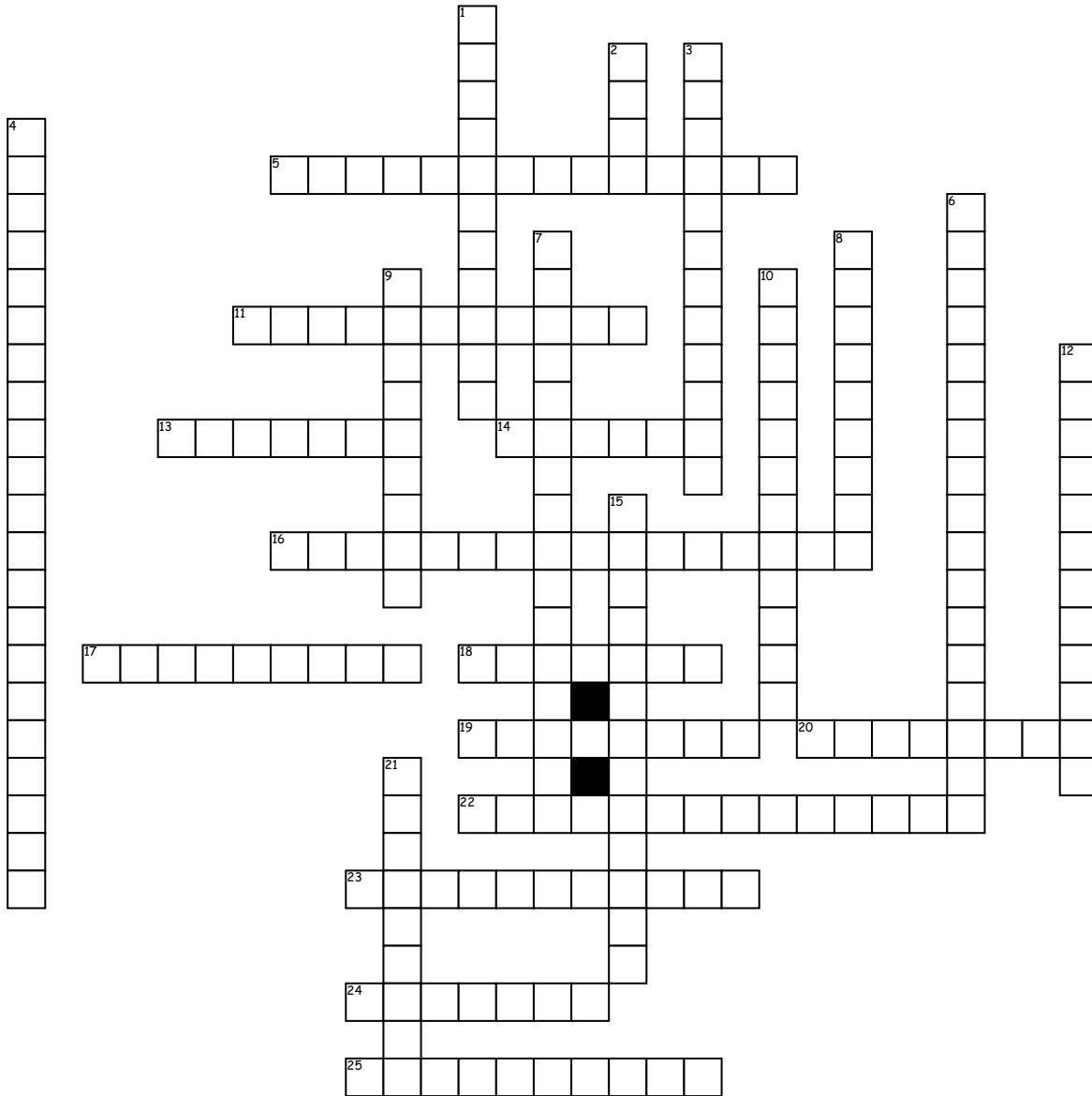

1. was an Act of the United States Congress that extended the Espionage Act of 1917 to cover a broader range of offenses
