

- 7. An international organization for collective defense in Southeast Asia created by the Southeast Asia Collective Defense Treaty to prevent the spread of Communism.
- 9. An independent agency of the United States Federal Government responsible for the civilian space program, as well as aeronautics and aerospace research.
- 10. A civilian foreign intelligence service of the federal government of the United States, tasked with gathering, processing, and analyzing national security information from around the world, primarily through the use of human intelligence.
- 14. A notional barrier separating the Soviet Union and the West
- 15. A war in which the weapons used, the nations or territory involved, or the objectives pursued are restricted in some way.
