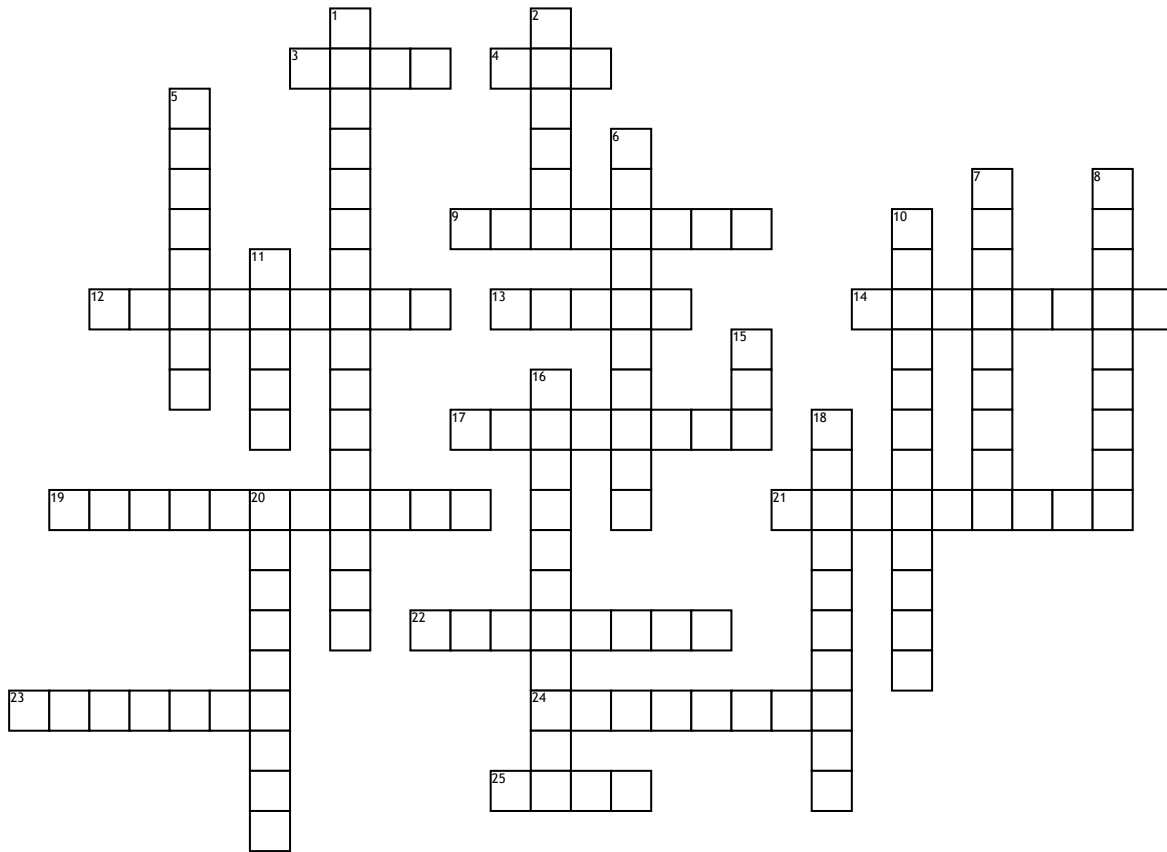


BOLTON D.C. CHEMICAL HAZARD CROSSWORD PUZZLE
