
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## **Basics of Riding**



## **Across**

- 2. Means opposite corners. This refers to 1 front leg on one side and 1 hind leg on the other side while the horse is trotting. This word is often used with the word posting (for example, your posting on the wrong diagonal).
- 3. The rider holds a partial standing position while riding. This is a common jumping position.
- 7. The change of the horse's movement or gait to another.
- 11. The horse canters with his front left leg extending out the farthest.

- 12. A fast 4 beat gait
- 13. To turn and go the other way.
- **15.** The signals you use to communicate or "talk" with your horse.
- 17. The rider doesn't post while the horse is trot.
- 18. Backing up with diagonal pairs.
- 19. A 3 beat gait

## Down

- 1. The rider rises and sits to the up and down motion of the horse's trot.
- 4. A slow 4 beat gait

- 5. A 2 beat diagonal gait
- 6. The horse canters with the right front leg extending the farthest.
- 8. Getting off of the horse.
- 9. Getting on the horse.
- **10.** The horse has come to a complete standstill.
- 14. The side closest to the middle of the ring.
- **16.** The side closest to the outside of the ring.
