
Birth Control Methods

- **2.** Four types: coil spring, flat spring, arcing spring, wide seal rim
- **4.** Device and/or practDevice to decrease the likelihood of conceiving or carrying a pregnancy to term
- **6.** A form of birth control used to save the life or health of the mother
- **8.** A form of birth control that can be oral, injectable, or implantable
- **11.** This is the only acceptable form of contraception to the Roman Catholic Church

- **12.** This method combines BBT and Cervical Mucus methods
- **14.** A type of female sterilization where MD ejects occlusion agents into fallopian tubes
- **15.** Consciously deciding when to avoid pregnancy during reproductive years
- **16.** Easiest and most commonly used form of male sterilization
- 1. Work by reducing sperm's motility

- **3.** An acronym for Benefits, Risks, Alternatives, Inquires, Decisions, Explanations, Documentation
- **5.** A small T-shaped device with bendable arms for insertion though the cervix.
- **7.** This type of birth control is 100% effective is used correctly
- **9.** Intentional prevention of pregnancy during sex
- **10.** Put this on before contact is initiated and remove after withdrawal and ejaculation
- **13.** A contraceptive_____ should be left in place for at least 6 hours after intercourse
