

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## Blood



## Across

- **5.** An absence of strains in an otherwise continuous bloodstain pattern
- **8.** A drop of blood from which awave, cast-off, or satellite spatter
- **9.** A surface upon which blood has been deposited
- **10.** A bloodstain pattern which results from blood dripping into blood
- 11. The path of the blood drop, as it moves through space, from the impact site to the target
- **12.** Blood which has been reduced to a direction as the source of fine spray, as a result of the energy or force applied to it

- **13.** That blood which has been dispersed as a result of force applied to a source of blood.
- **15.** Blood directed back towards the source of energy or force that caused the spatter

## Down

- 1. The directionality of a bloodstain or pattern which indicates the direction the blood was traveling when it impacted the target surface
- **2.** Blood which travels in the same direction as the source of energy or force which caused the spatter

- **3.** The acute angle formed between the direction of blood drop and the plane of the surface it strikes
- **4.** Evidence that liquid blood has come into contact with a surface.
- **6.** That point where force encounters a source of blood
- 7. The pointed or elongated stains which radiate away from the central area of a bloodstain
- **14.** The deflection of blood after impact with a target surface that results in straining of a second target surface.
