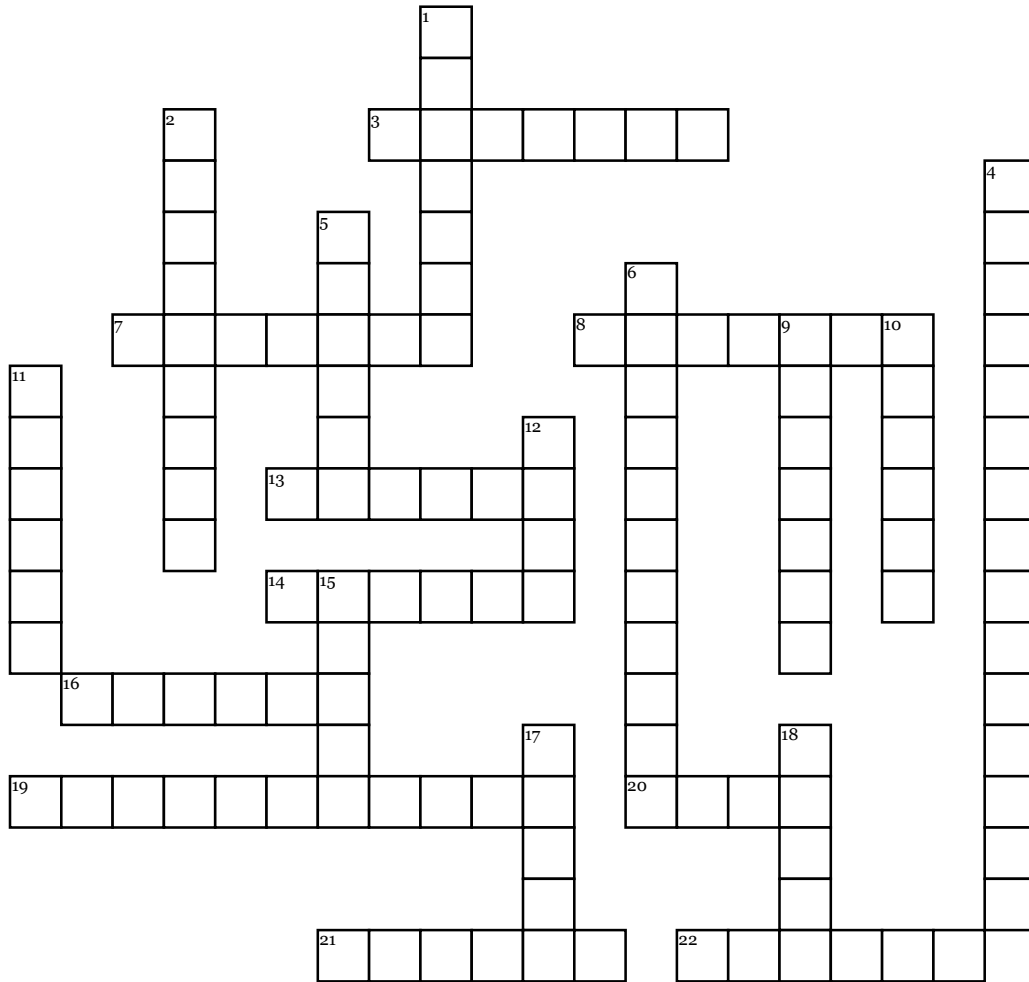

- 3. Second of the Four Noble Truths, selfish desire, which causes dukkha (suffering)
- 7. Cycle of death and rebirth to which life in the material world is bound
- 8. Development or production in the sense of calling into existence; spiritual cultivation
- 13. Compassion; part of the spiritual path of Buddhism
- 14. Important Buddhist concept translated as "suffering", "pain", or "stress" in relation to life
- 16. Enlightened one; founder of Buddhism
- 19. Person who has attained enlightenment but postpones nirvana in order to help others achieve enlightenment
- 20. Moral conduct; one of the three sections of the Eightfold Path

- 21. Individual who has achieved individual enlightenment
- 22. Direct insight (wisdom) into the truth taught by Buddha, as a faculty required to attain enlightenment; one of the three divisions of the Eightfold Path

- 1. Condition of great peace or happiness (enlightenment); the final goal of Buddhism
- 2. The Prince who would soon found Buddhism
- 4. Life is suffering sickness and death. Desires can never be fulfilled. There is a way to stop suffering. This way is to follow the Eightfold Path
- 5. Teaching or religion of the Buddha.
- 6. Buddha, Dharma, Sangha

- 9. Idea that there is no permanent, underlying substance that can be called a soul
- 10. mpermanence; essential doctrine/part of 3 marks of existence
- 11. Buddhist community of monks and nuns
- 12. Supernatural power wielded by gods and demons to produce illusions
- 15. refers to an aspect of guidance along the Buddhist Paths to liberation where a conscious, voluntary action is driven by an incomplete reasoning about its direction
- 17. Sum of a person's actions in this and previous states of existence, viewed as deciding their fate in future existences
- 18. Intense craving or greed
