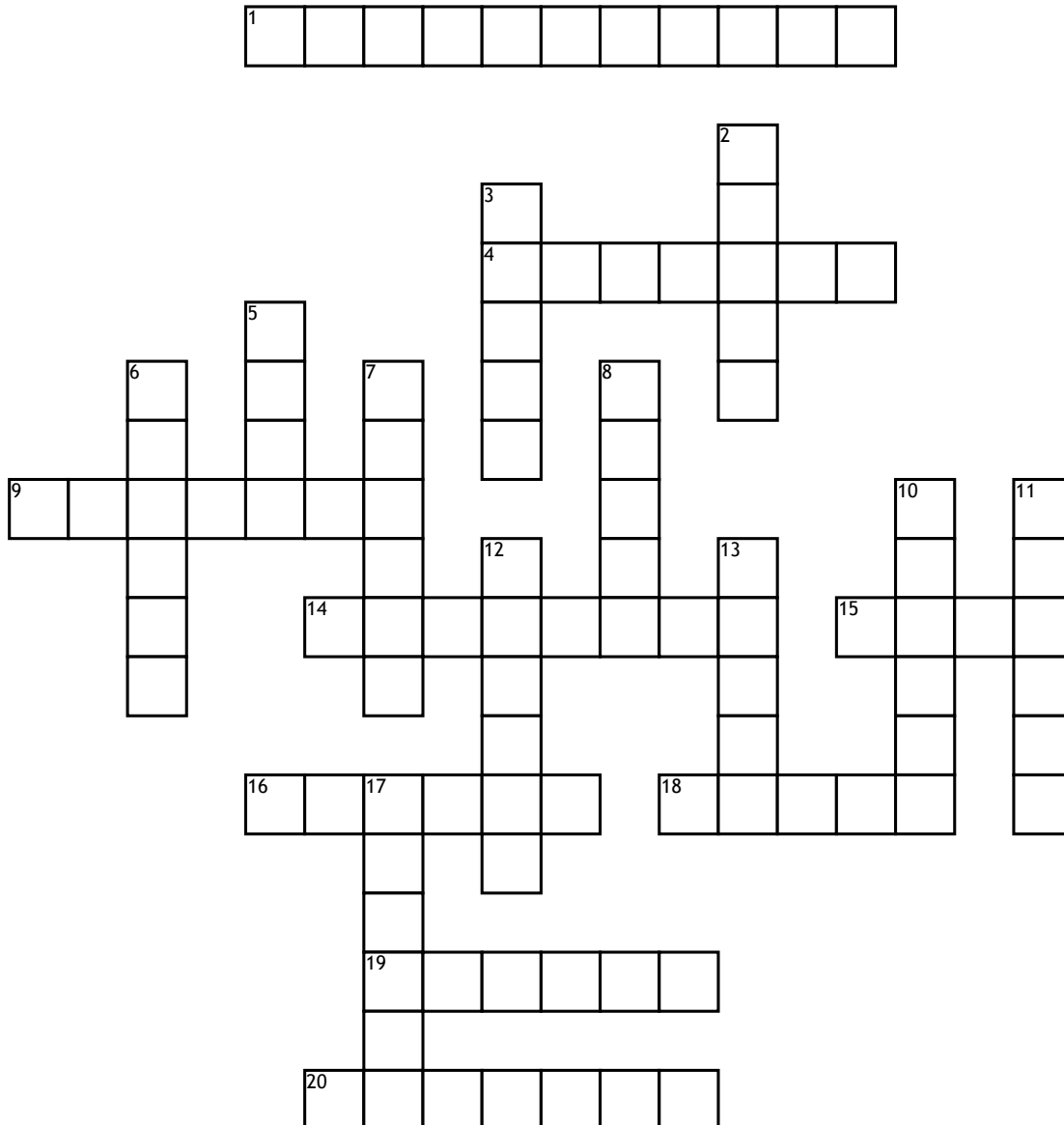

- 1. Person who has attained enlightenment but postpones nirvana in order to help others achieve enlightenment
- 4. Condition of great peace or happiness (enlightenment); the final goal of Buddhism
- 9. Development or production in the sense of calling into existence; spiritual cultivation
- 14. the largest Buddhist division
- 15. Supernatural power wielded by gods and demons to produce illusions
- 16. Enlightened one; founder of Buddhism
- 18. Sum of a person's actions in this and previous states of existence, viewed as deciding their fate in future existences

19. Compassion; part of the spiritual path of Buddhism

20. Cycle of death and rebirth to which life in the material world is bound

- 2. refers to an aspect of guidance along the Buddhist Paths to liberation where a conscious, voluntary action is driven by an incomplete reasoning about its direction
- 3. Impermanence; essential doctrine/part of 3 marks of existence
- 5. Moral conduct; one of the three sections of the Eightfold Path
- 6. Direct insight (wisdom) into the truth taught by Buddha, as a faculty required to attain enlightenment; one of the three divisions of the Eightfold Path
- 7. Individual who has achieved individual enlightenment
