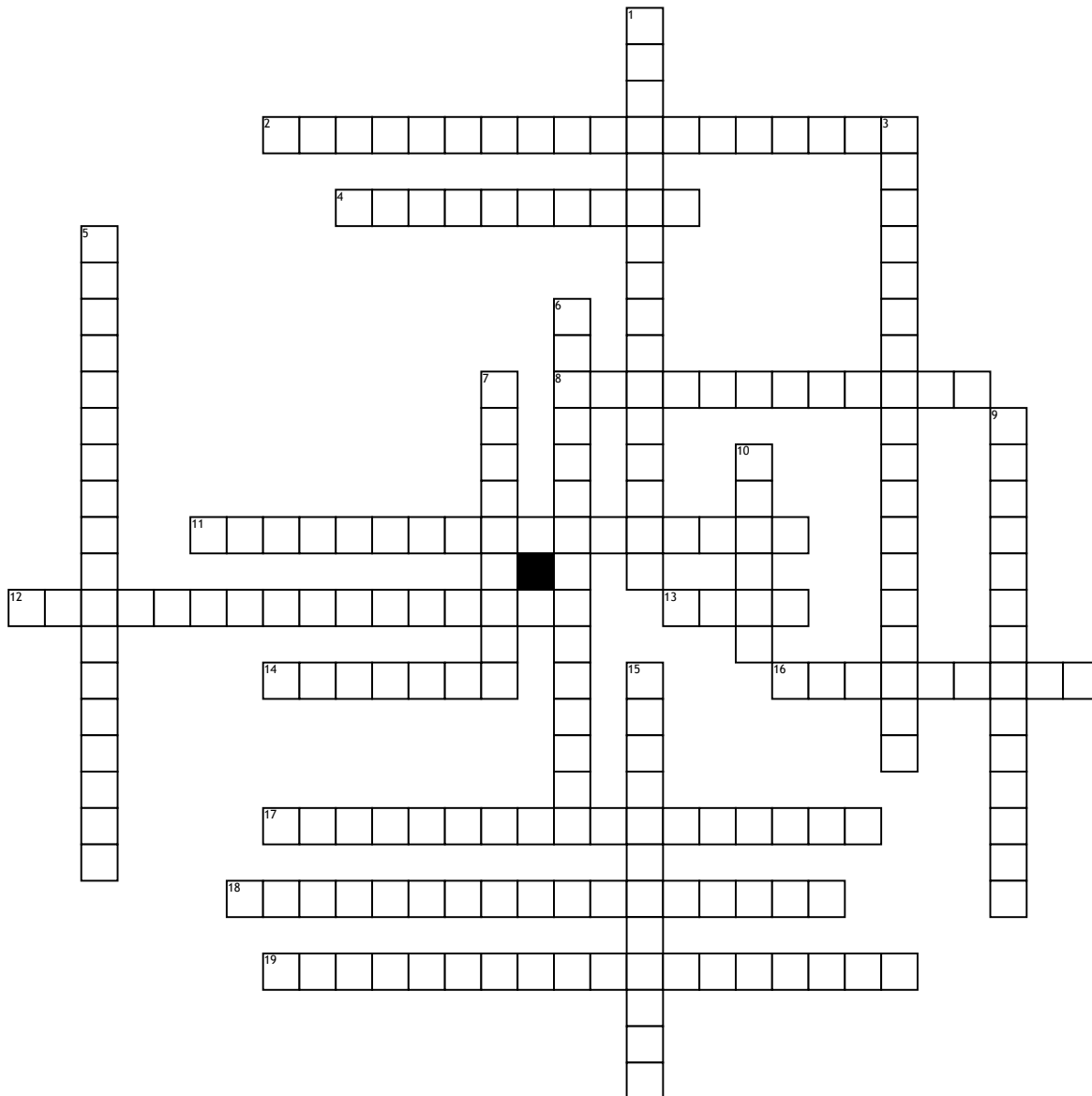

2. an act of vesting the legislative, executive, and judicial powers of government in separate bodies

4. mixed or compound mode of government, combining a general government with regional governments in a single political system

8. the action of signing or giving formal consent to a treaty, contract, or agreement, making it officially valid

11. developed to ensure that no one branch of government would become too powerful

12. a body of electors established by the United States Constitution, which forms every four years for the sole purpose of electing the president and vice president of the United States

13. 1.a constitutional right to reject a decision or proposal made by a law-making body

14. a body of advisers to the president, composed of the heads of the executive departments of the government

16. the restriction of the arbitrary exercise of power by subordinating it to well-defined and established laws

17. adherence to or government according to constitutional principles

18. a political system in which legalized force is restricted through delegated and enumerated powers

19. an international agreement made by the executive branch of the US government without ratification by the Senate

3. a custom whereby presidential appointments are confirmed only if there is no objection to them by the senators from the appointee's state

5. a doctrine in political theory that government is created by and subject to the will of the people

6. an amendment that has gone through one of the processes outlined in Article V of the Constitution and adds to or changes the Constitution's wording

7. a minor change or addition designed to improve a text, piece of legislation

9. review by the US Supreme Court of the constitutional validity of a legislative act

10. a formally concluded and ratified agreement between countries
