
CH. 5 - Printing Comes to Europe

- **1.** A translucent emblem produced by pressure from a raised design on the mold, and visible when the piece of paper is held to the light.
- **6.** The term for printing with independent, movable, and reusable bits of metal or wood, each which has a raised letter form on one face.
- **10.** Printing from an image that is incised or cut down into a metal printing surface.
- **11.** A wood or metal block with the indentation of a letter on one face, used for recreating a letter in a specific typeface.

2. Credited as being the first type face designer, playing a key role in format development and type design for the forty-two-line Bible.

- **3.** The technical term for the relief printing from a raised surface that originated in Asia.
- **4.** A type of printing unknown in origin, that originated in Asia and Europe soon after the Crusades, usually used for illustrations and pictorial designs.
- **5.** A book called "The Art of Dying", which advised people on the preparation and meeting of ones final hour.
- **7.** The wood or metal block with a letter on one face used for printing.
- **8.** A press used to create and duplicate typefaces.
- **9.** A German man credited with the invention of the printing press in Europe.
