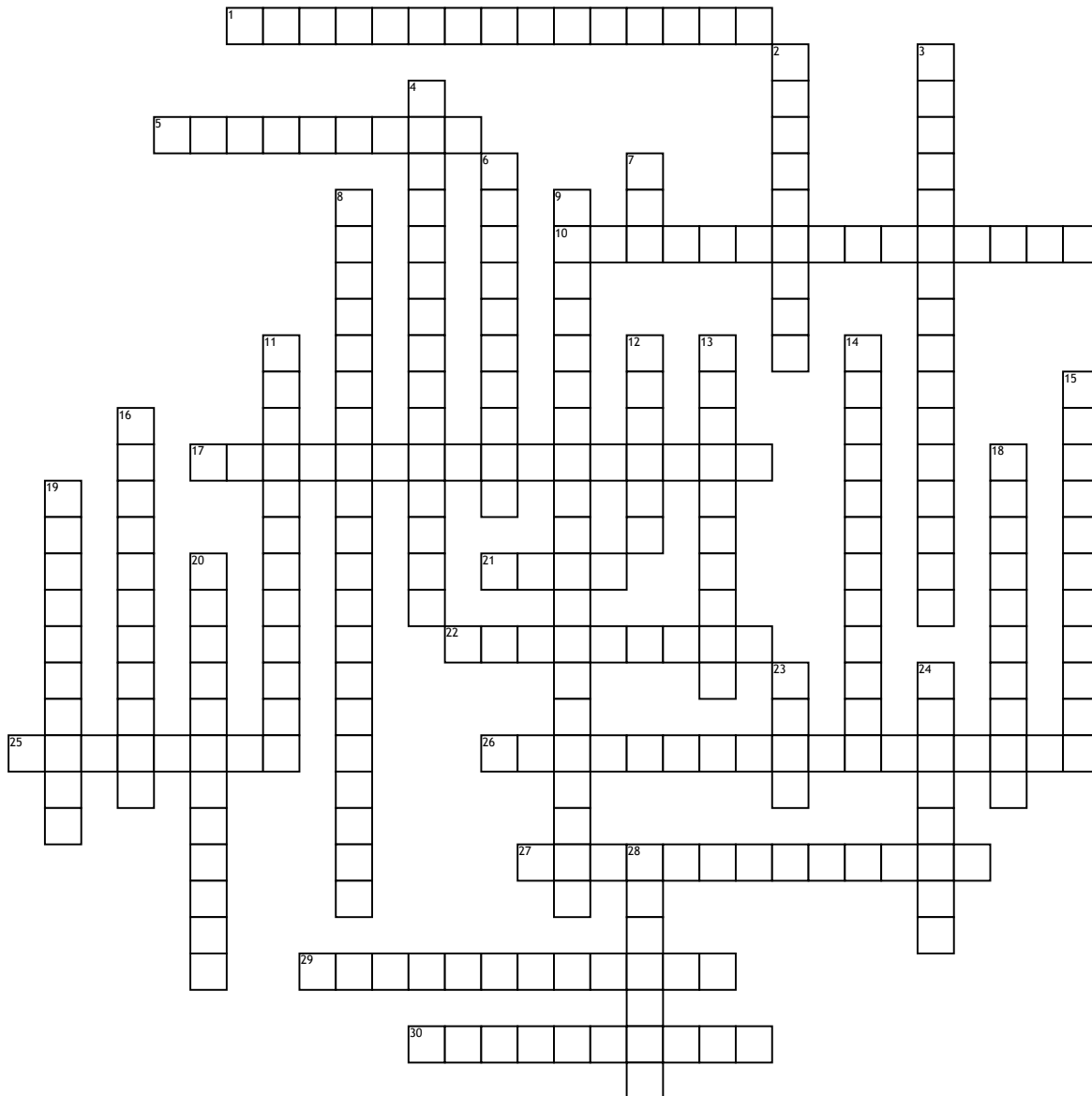

2. the duties or activities that are part of a job or occupation

 6. stage in economic cycle, relatively low unemployment & high total income prevail, leading to high purchasing power - more spending
 7. a test that measures the critical thinking mathematical, reasoning, and writing skills students need to do college-level work
 8. Unpaid experiences; students work to get experience, contacts, or help out. The experiences are not necessarily career related and not usually supervised by school personnel
 9. college program leading to an associate (2-year) or a bachelor's (4-year) degree; generally following high/secondary school
 11. economic activities belonging to or characteristic of a state
 12. a direction of movement
 13. a process or period in which something undergoes a change and passes from one state, stage, form, or activity to another
 14. economic activities of the locale in which you live

15. a vocational school, also called a trade school, is a higher-level learning institution that specializes in providing students with the vocational education and technical skills they need in order to perform the tasks of a particular job. Students typically earn a credential or a certificate
 16. Money awarded to students based on academic or other achievements to help pay for education expenses. Scholarships generally do not have to be repaid
 18. a feeling of enthusiasm, interest, or commitment that makes somebody want to do something, or something that causes such a feeling
 19. a collection of colleges, has undergraduate programs which award bachelor degrees and graduate program for masters' degrees and doctorates
 20. short-term experience that allows the student to follow an experienced worker and see the day-to-day activities of a particular career
 23. a practice test that measures the critical thinking, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills that students need to do college-level work
 24. stage in the economic cycle where employment and production begin to rise to normal levels after a slump
 28. a sum of money charged for teaching or instruction by a school, college, or university
