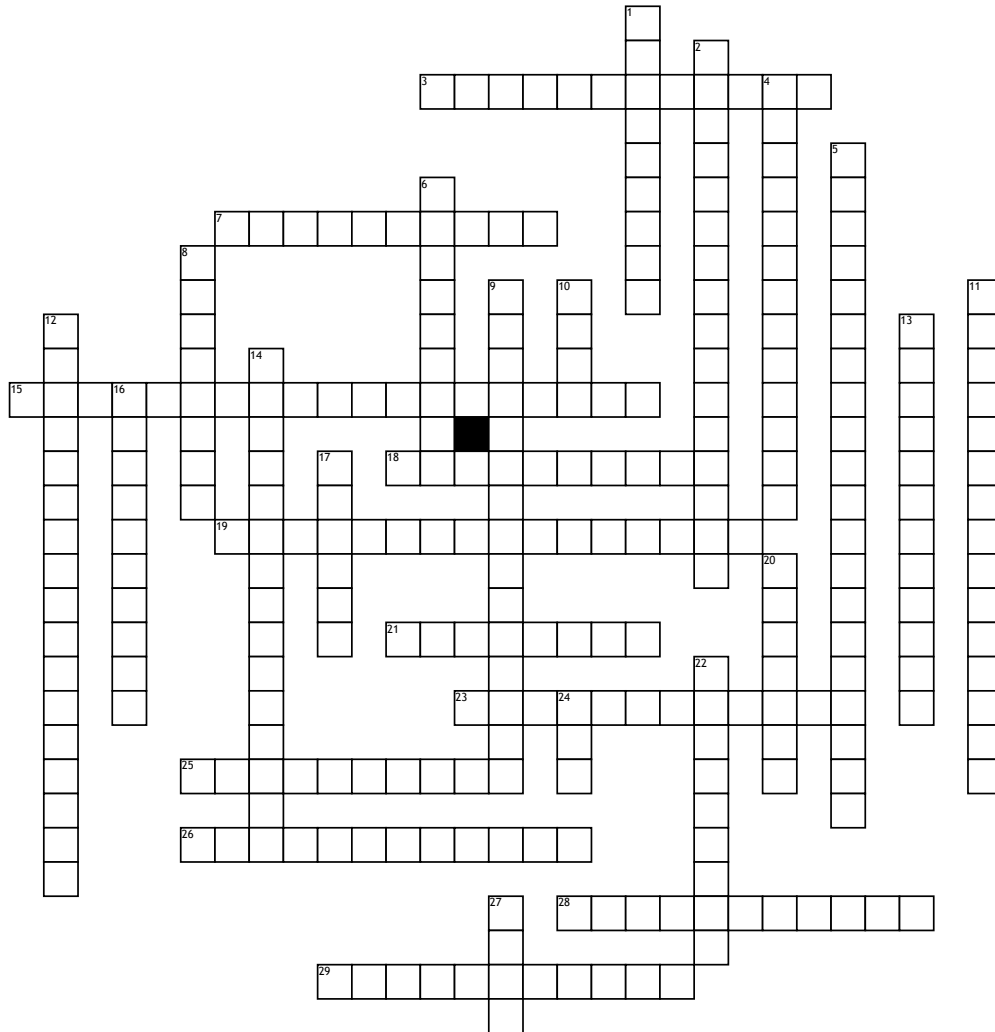

- 3. economic activities belonging to or characteristic of a state

- 15. Unpaid experiences; students work to get experience, contracts, or help out. The experiences are not necessarily career related and not usually supervised by school personnel
- 18. a process or period in which something undergoes a change and passes from one state, stage, form, or activity to another
- 19. the continuing development of knowledge and skills that people experience after formal education and throughout their lives
- 21. stage in the economic cycle where employment and production begin in rise to normal levels after a slump

- 25. stage in economic cycle, relatively low unemployment & high total income prevail, leading to high purchasing power - more spending

28. a vocational school, a trade school, or a high-level learning institution that specializes in providing students with the vocational education and technical skills they need in the order to perform the tasks of a particular job. Student typically earn a credential or a certificate

29. Money awarded to students based on academic or other achievements to help pay for education expense. Scholarships generally do not have to be repaid
