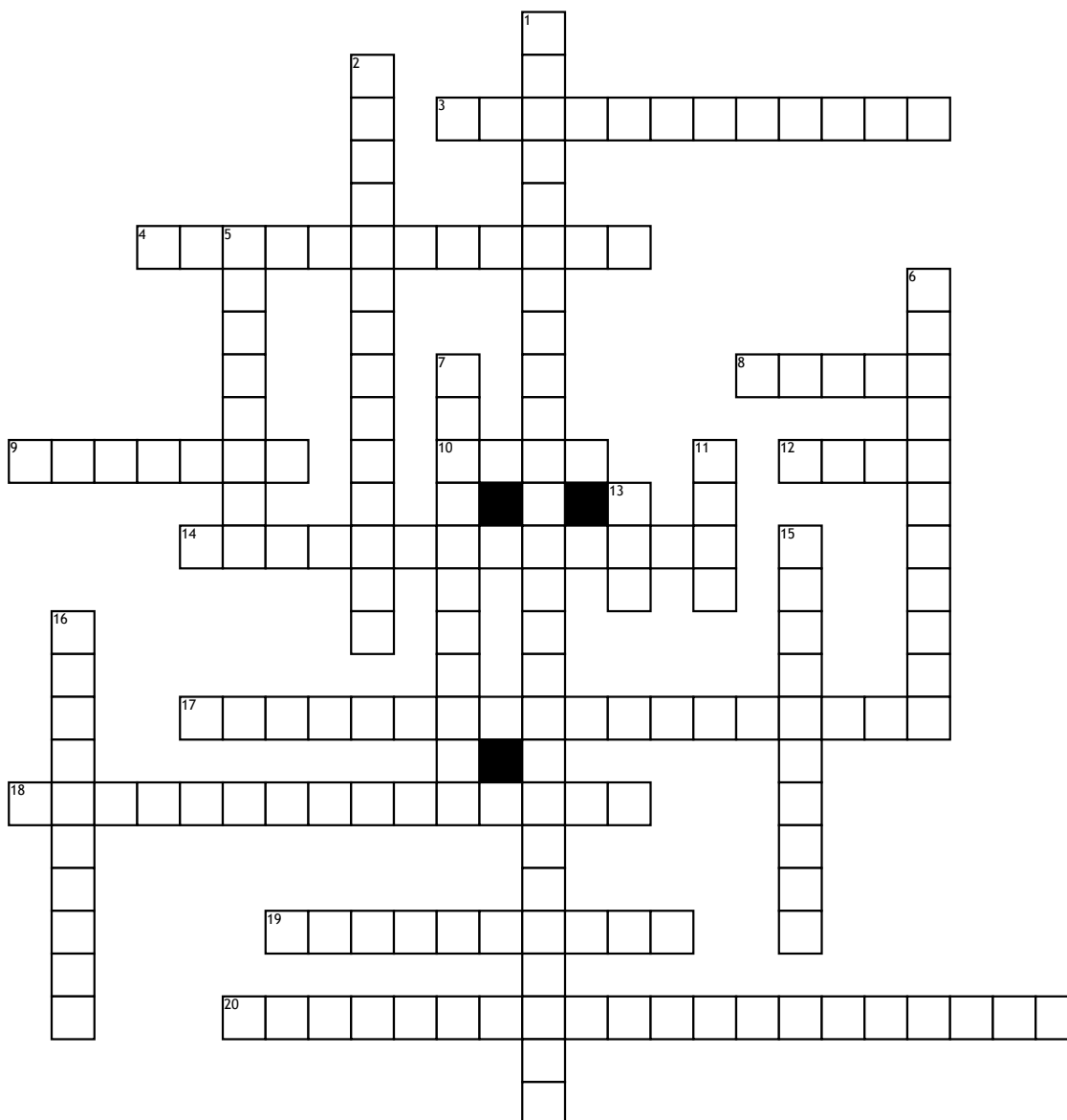

1. A doctrine of military strategy in which a full-scale use of nuclear weapons would cause the complete annihilation of both sides.
