

- **4.** narrowing of the aorta, the large blood vessel that branches off your heart and delivers oxygen-rich blood to your body
- 7. defined as the failure of the normal pater circulatory transition that occurs after birth; seen as a right to left shunt through the PDA pater done 5. dy
- **9.** defect in the ventricular septum, the wall dividing the left and right ventricles of the heart.
- 10. acronym for a term that refers to a group of serious heart defects that are present from birth this test is done after the first 24hr of life

1. condition wherein the ductus arteriosus fails to close after birth

- **2.** defect in the septum between the heart's two upper chambers (atria)
- **3.** also known as alprostadil, is naturally occurring and used as a medication to maintain a patent ductus arteriosus until surgery can be done
- **5.** dynamic or fixed obstruction of flow from the right ventricle of the heart to the pulmonary artery
- 6. NSAID used to treat/close the PDA
- **8.** a free radical gas that is used to relax the pulmonary bed when introduced during presentation of PPHN
