

- **3.** Heart chamber that receives deoxygenated blood from right atrium
- **5.** Found between the right atrium and right ventricle
- **6.** A change within a cell, during which the cell undergoes a shift in electric charge distribution, resulting in less negative charge inside the cell.
- **12.** Interior layer of blood vessel
- **14.** Buildup of fats, cholesterol and other substances in and on your artery walls
- **16.** Temporarily slows the impulse as it passes from atria to ventricles
- 17. Heart's natural pacemaker

- **18.** Dilatation of blood vessels, which decreases blood pressure.
- **19.** Pull on the chordae tendinae and help to prevent prolapsing of the AV valves
- **20.** Found between the right ventricle and the pulmonary artery

- Phase of the heartbeat when the heart muscle contracts and pumps blood from the chambers into the arteries.
- **2.** Force that opposes the flow of blood
- **4.** Thin blood vessel that exchanges materials with body tissues

- 7. Heart chamber that receives blood from lungs
- **8.** Small vessel that carries blood away from capillaries
- **9.** General name for vessels that carry blood back to the heart
- **10.** Located between the left ventricle and the left atrium
- 11. The strongest heart chamber
- **13.** Holds on to valves to prevent prolapse
- **15.** When the heart muscle contracts pushing the blood out of the heart and into the large blood vessels of the circulatory system
