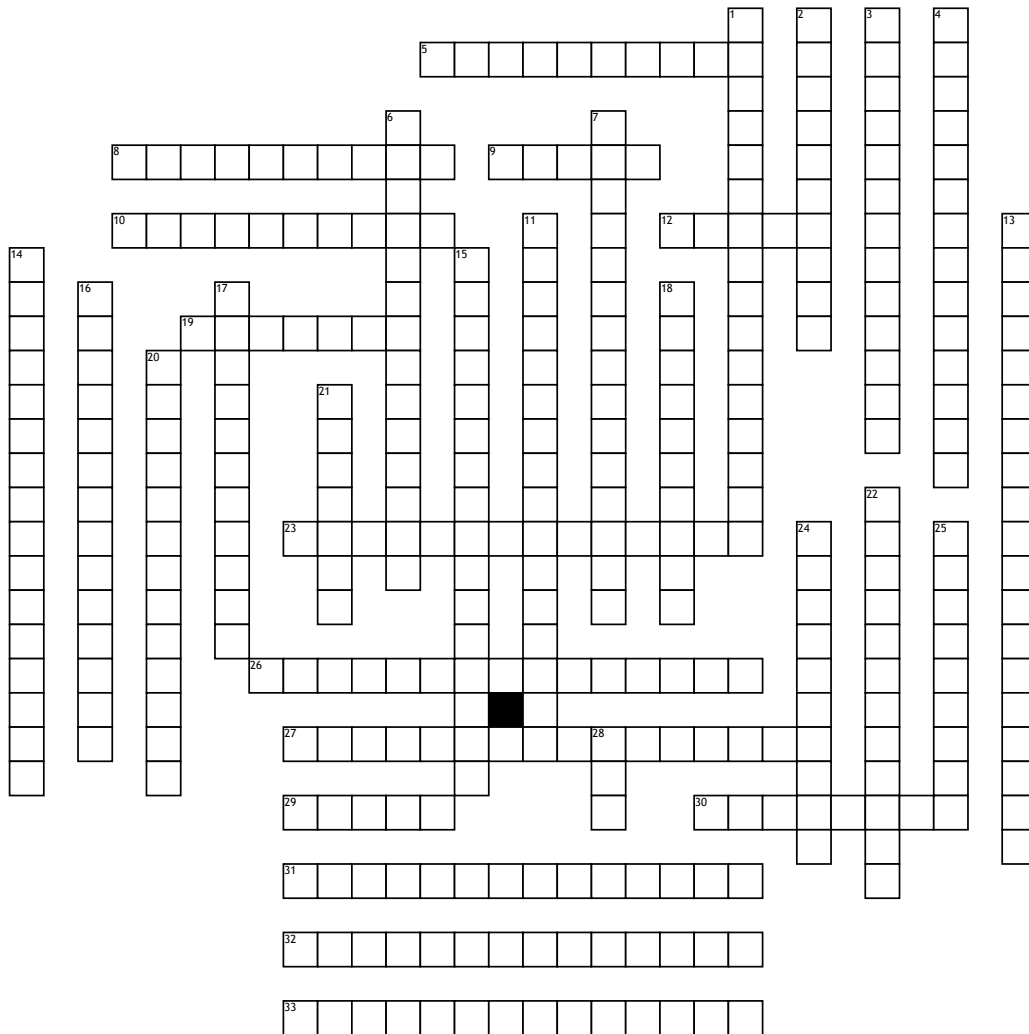

29. Federal Student Aid, a part of the U.S. Department of Education, is the largest provider of student financial aid in the nation, provides grants, loans, and work-study funds for college or career school

30. an activity or role assigned to somebody or something

31. involves students being enrolled in two separate, academically related institutions.

32. an official document that gives proof and details of something such as personal status, educational achievements, ownership, or authenticity.

33. postgraduate academic degree awarded by universities, highest level of academic degree. Everyone is familiar with the medical doctor, who holds an M.D. (Medical Doctorate). But you can earn a doctorate in almost any subject area, Doctor of Philosophy, abbreviated as PhD.

1. not officially prepared, organized, or sanctioned

2. a professional or industry certification proving a person's qualifications, awarded for occupational competency typically by passing an exam.

14. 2 year college degree from a community college, university, college, or technical school. The recipient of an Associate's Degree can then transfer the credits toward a 4 year Bachelor's

15. the continuing development of knowledge and skills that people experience after formal education and throughout their lives

16. One bound by legal agreement to work for another for a specific amount of time in return for instruction in a trade, art, or business.

17. a relationship in which two or more things are mutual or complementary, or one thing is caused by another.

18. extended period of negative economic activity; unemployment, declining income & production.

20. the natural fluctuation of the economy between periods of expansion and contraction. Factors such as gross domestic product, interest rates, levels of employment and consumer spending help to determine the current stage of the economic cycle.

21. the wealth and resources of a country or region, especially in terms of the production and consumption of goods and services, careful management of available resources.

22. short-term experience that allows the students to follow an experienced worker and see the day-to-day activities of a particular career.

24. the quality of being adequately or well qualified in a skill or ability.

25. a sharp increase in the costs of goods and services

28. educational programs that specialize in the skilled trades, applied sciences, modern technologies, and career preparation.
