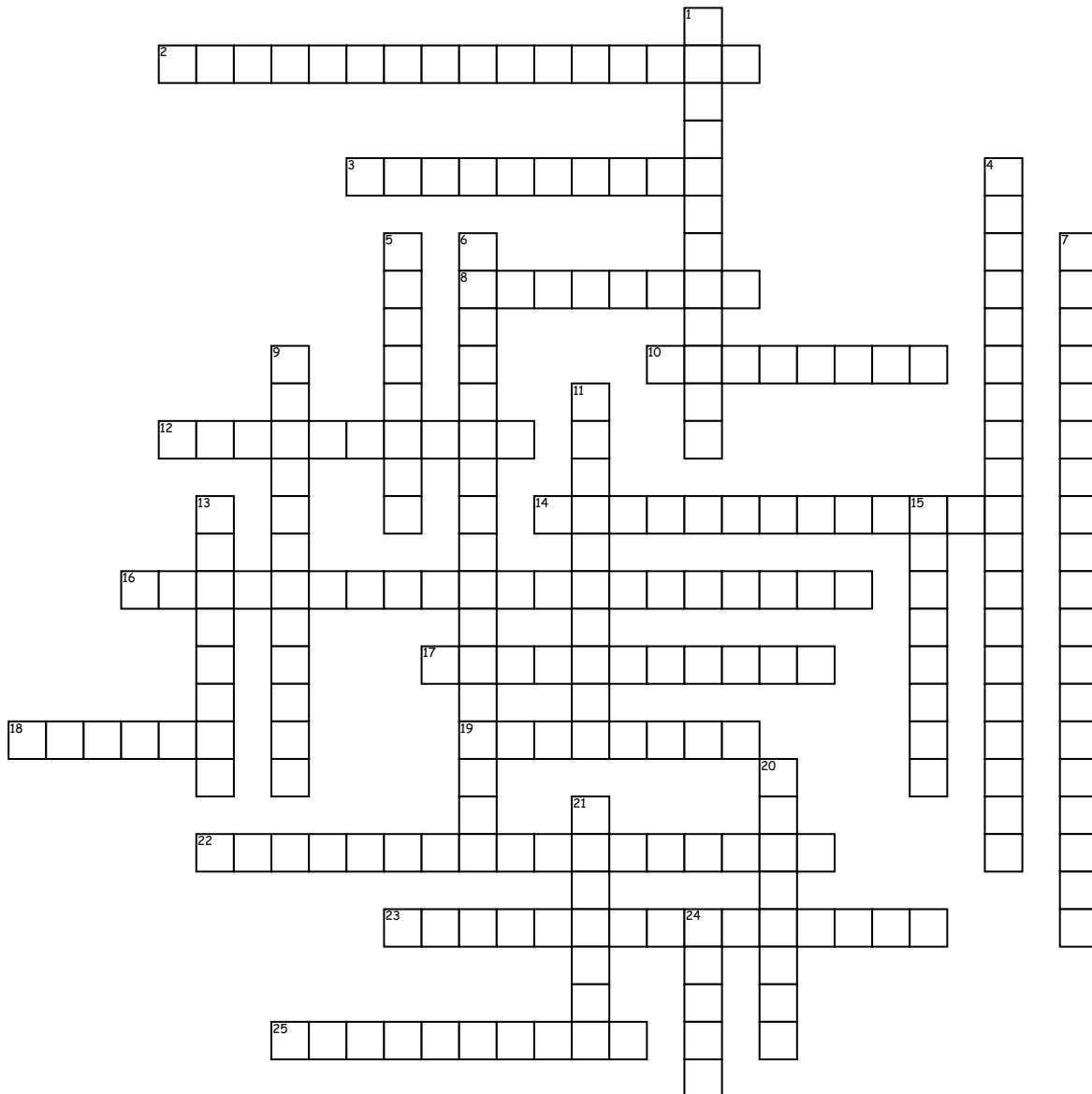


# Ch. 1 History Crossword Puzzle

2. The part of the government that decides what bills would be introduced into the legislature.
3. The side of Canada, that in the legislative assembly, were willing to retain equal representation of the two sides and resisted to spend on transportation improvements.

10. Appointed by the Crown, would appoint the members of the legislative council and executive council.
12. A person who built and owned a business.
14. A slave in the United States who escaped to Canada West and became involved in the Underground Railroad helping other slaves escape, with 19 successful trips back and forth between nations.
16. A Scottish-Canadian-American journalist and politician. He was a leader during the 1837 Upper Canada Rebellion.
