

2. a rock stele, found in 1799, inscribed with a decree issued at Memphis, Egypt

4. a body of a human being or animal that has been ceremonially preserved by removal of the internal organs, treatment with natron and resin, and wrapping in bandages.

7. a graduated pillar or other vertical surface, serving to indicate the height to which the Nile rises during its annual floods.

8. A collection of ancient Egyptian funerary texts from various periods.

10. the delta formed in Northern Egypt (Lower Egypt) where the Nile River spreads out and drains into the Mediterranean

13. a monumental structure with a square or triangular base and sloping sides that meet in a point at the top, especially one built of stone as a royal tomb in ancient Egypt.
