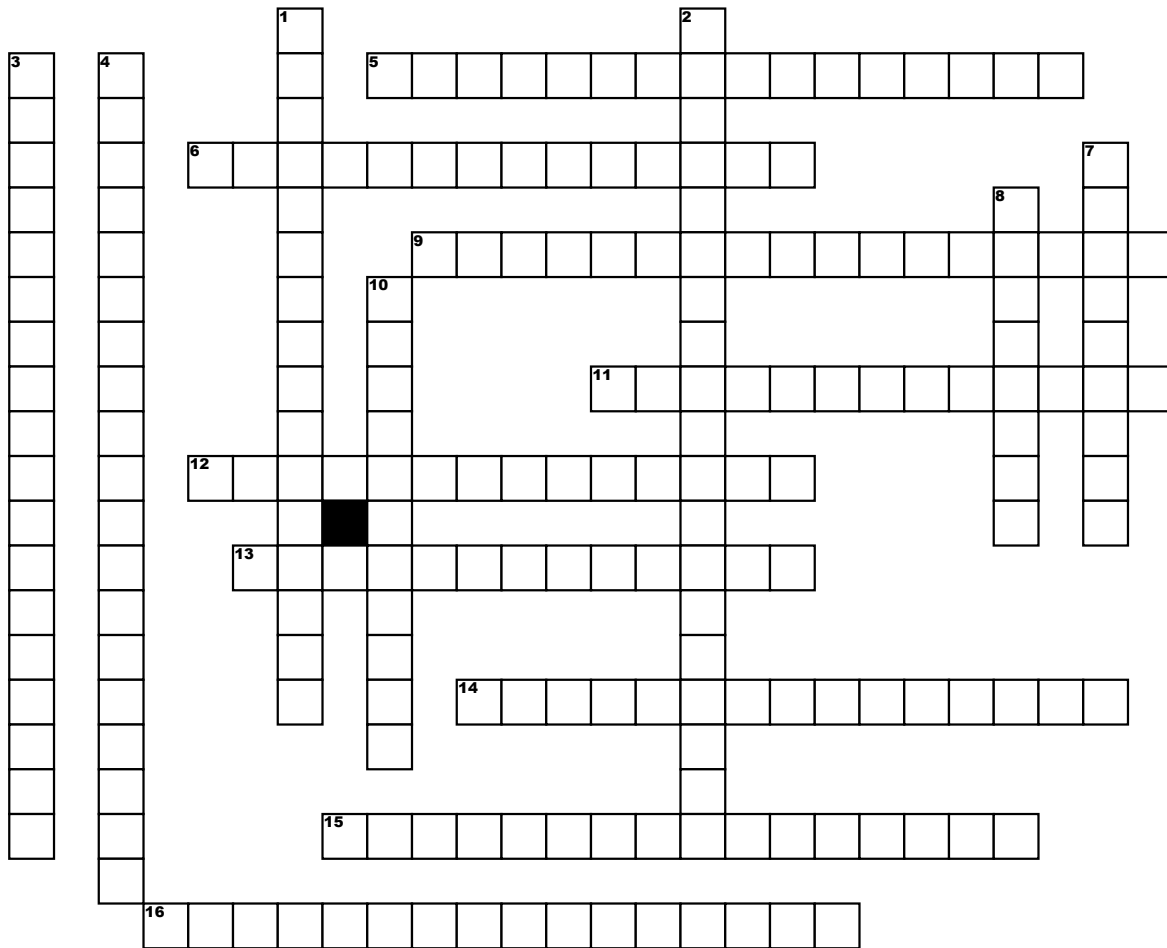

9. A law enacted in 1854 that establishes the territories of Kansas and Nebraska and gave their residents the right to decide whether to allow slavery

11. An Amendment to an 1846 military appropriation bill proposing that none of the territory acquired in the war of Mexico would be open to slavery

12. A best selling novel by Harriet Beecher Stowe's published in 1852 that portrayed slavery as a great moral evil

13. A political party formed in 1884 to opposed the extension of slavery into u.s territories

14. The modern political party that was formed in 1854 by opponents of slavery in the territories

15. A series of congressional measures intended to settle the major disagreements between free states and slave states

16. A name given to the American party formed in the 1850s to curtail the political influence of immigrants

1. The idea expressed by Stephan Douglas in 1858 that any territories could exclude slavery by simply refusing to pass laws supporting it

2. Statutes passed in nine northern states in the 1850s that forbade the imprisonment of runaway slaves and guaranteed jury trials for fugitive slaves

3. A system in which the residents vote to decide an issue

4. A system of routes along which runaway slaves were helped to escape to Canada or the safe areas of free states

7. The formal withdrawal of a state from the union

8. Favoring the interests of native -born people over foreign born people

10. The confederate states of America, a confederation formed in 1861 by the southern states after their secession from the union
