

- 1. A series of congressional measures intended intended to settle the major disagreements between free states and slave states
- **2.** An act part of the Compromise of 1850, designed to ensure escaped slaves would be returned to bondage
- **3.** A law that gave Kansas and Nebraska residents the right to decide whether or not to allow slavery
- **4.** A law passed in 9 states in the North, that forbade the imprisonment of runaway slaves and gave fugitive slaves a right to a trial

- 7. The confederate states of America, a confederation formed in 1861 by the Southern states after their secession from the Union
