

- 1. A admendment in the u.s constitution, adopted in 1865, that has abolished slavery and involuntary servitude
- 2. Famous speech deleivered by Abraham Lincoln in November 1863, at the dedication of a national cemetery on the cite of the battle of Gettysburg
- **3.** A court order requiring authorities to bring a prisoner before the court so that the court can determine wether the prisoner is being held legally
- **4.** The drafting of citizens for military service
- **5.** Legislation passed act in 1863 to make banking safer for investors. It's provision included a system of federally chartered banks, new requirements for loans, and a system for the inspection of banks.
- **6.** Northern democrat who advocated making peace with the confederacy during the civil war
- 7. An ironclad ship used by the south in the civil war
- **8.** A tax on earnings
