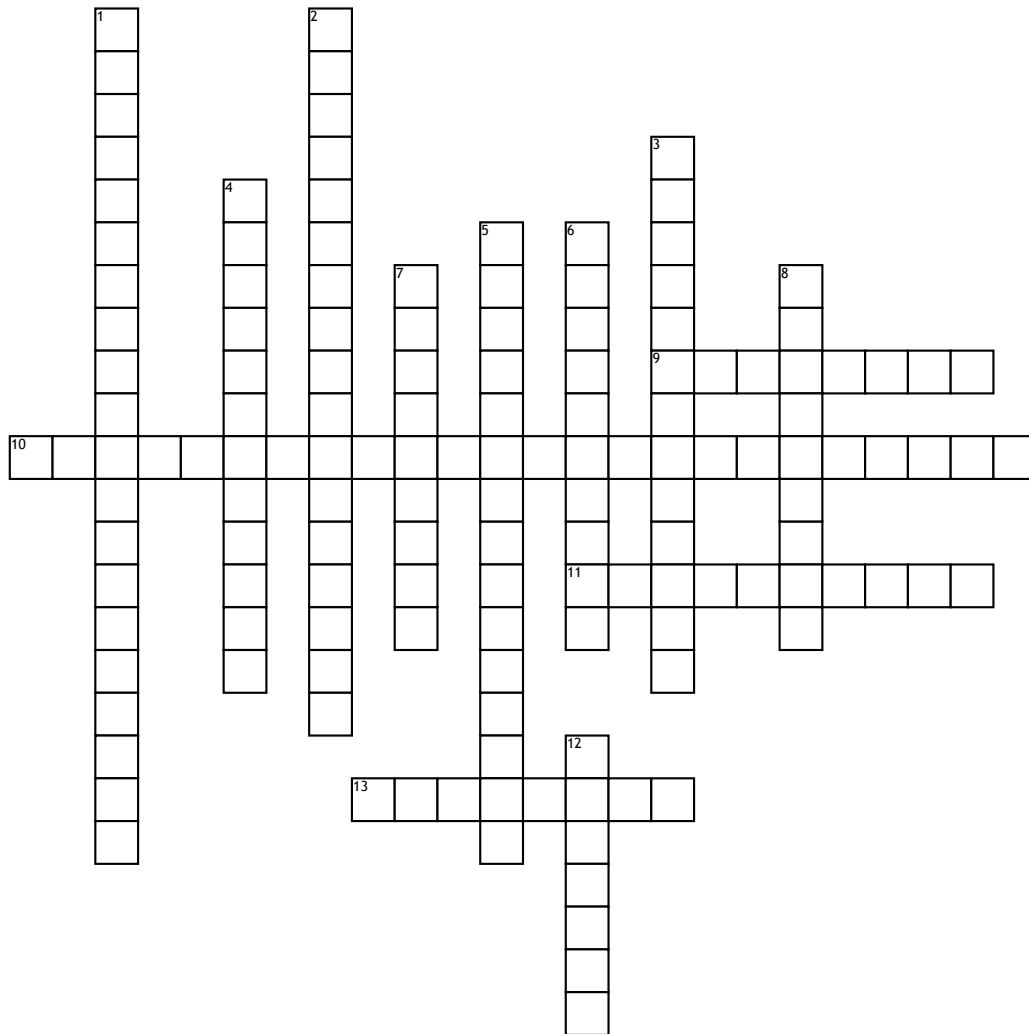


Chapter 11 civil war

- 9. A three part strategy by which the union proposed to defeat the confederacy in the civil war
- 10. An executive order made by Abraham Lincoln on January 1st, 1863, freeing the slaves in all regions behind confederate lines
- 11. Town near Appomattox Virginia where Lee surrendered to Grant on April 9 1865, thus ending the civil war
- 13. An international organization that provides relief for people in times of war or natural disasters. Clara Barton founded the American branch in 1881

- 1. A amendment in the U.S. constitution, adopted in 1865, that has abolished slavery and involuntary servitude
- 2. Famous speech delivered by Abraham Lincoln in November 1863, at the dedication of a national cemetery on the site of the battle of Gettysburg
- 3. A court order requiring authorities to bring a prisoner before the court so that the court can determine whether the prisoner is being held legally
- 4. The drafting of citizens for military service

- 5. Legislation passed act in 1863 to make banking safer for investors. It's provision included a system of federally chartered banks, new requirements for loans, and a system for the inspection of banks.
- 6. Northern democrat who advocated making peace with the confederacy during the civil war
- 7. An ironclad ship used by the south in the civil war
- 8. A tax on earnings
- 12. A ironclad ship used by the north in the civil war
