
Chapter 12 Surgical Wounds

- **3.** A technique of bringing tissue together by placing individual sutures close together
- **5.** The amount of force or stress a suture can withstand before breaking

- **6.** To bring tissues together by sutures or other means
- **7.** Scar tissue that lacks flexibility, causing constriction
- **8.** Scar formation of the abdominal viscera
- **10.** A blood filled space in tissue, the result of a bleeding vessel
- **13.** To place a loop or tie around a blood vessel or duct
