

- **2.** The effect of external and internal forces on the anatomic tissues and the movements of the body.
- 7. Pertaining to anatomy.
- **8.** Pertaining to the nervous intervention of the muscles.
- **9.** Muscles that counteract the action of agonistic muscles.
- **10.** Articulation (bicondylar) formed by the medial and lateral femoral condyles and the medial and lateral tibial condyles.
- 11. Various internally secreted compounds formed in endocrine glands that affect the functions of specifically receptive organs or tissues.

- **12.** The aggregate of surrounding things, conditions, or influences.
- **13.** Fibrocartilaginous structures that are between the hyaline cartilage surfaces in some synovial joints (e.g., the knee).
- **14.** Four muscles of the anterior thigh: rectus femoris, vastus medialis, vastus intermedius, and vastus lateralis.
- 15. Cause of a condition is unknown.
- **16.** Angle made by the rectus femoris and the patellar tendon as they attach to the tibial tubercle.
- **17.** The three muscles that make up the posterior thigh: biceps femoris, semimembranosus, semitendinosus.

- 1. Abnormal softening of cartilage, typically noted between the patella and femur.
- **3.** Epiphyseal inflammation of the tibial tubercle.
- **4.** Articulation (saddle) formed by the posterior surface of the patella and the anterior surface of the femoral condyles.
- **5.** Muscles in a state of contraction as related to opposing muscles.
- **6.** Death of tissue caused by the lack of blood supply.
