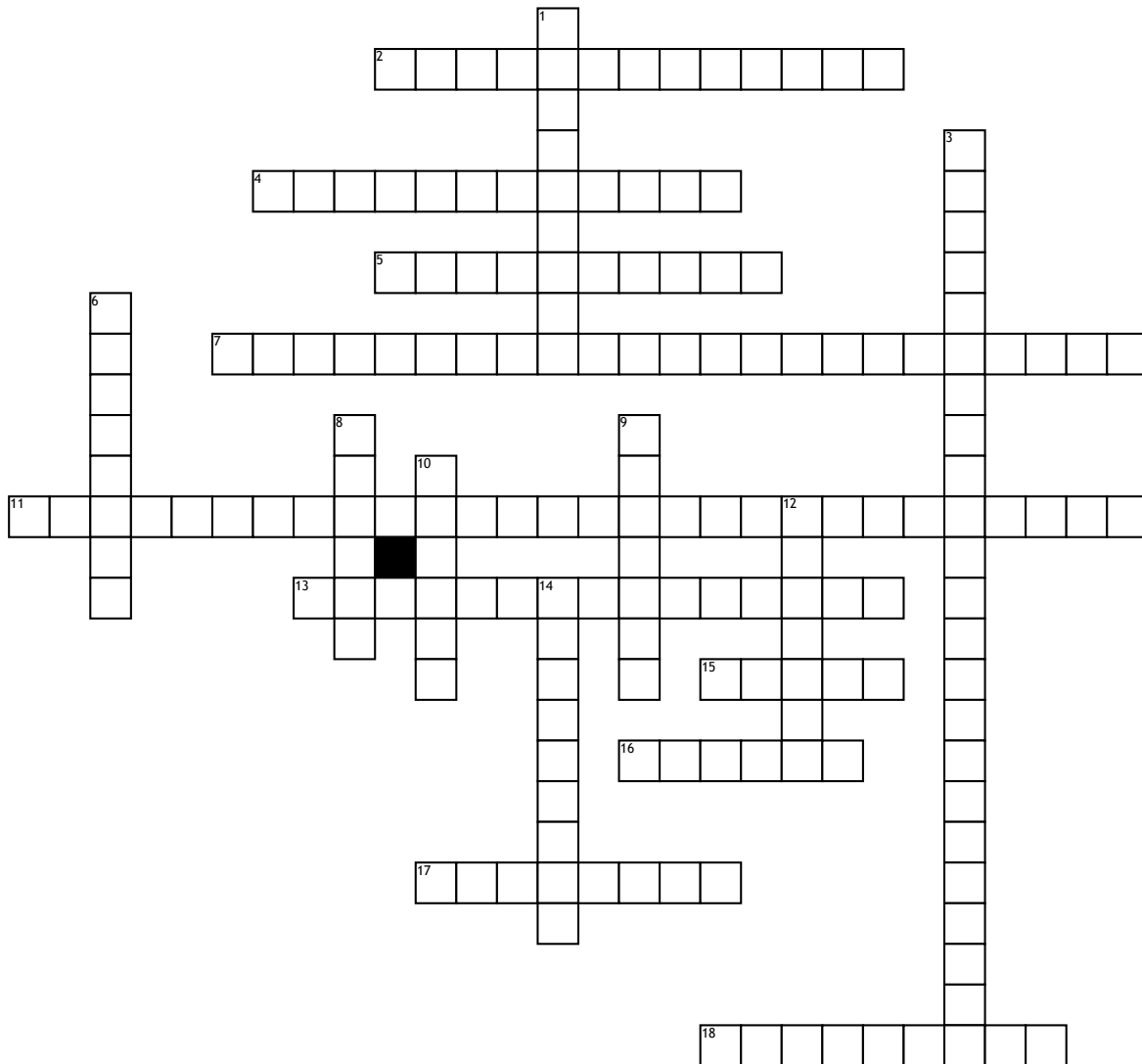


Chapter 20 Word Puzzle

2. Abnormally increased concentration of glucose in the blood
 4. Abnormally diminished concentration of glucose in the blood
 5. Escape of blood from the vessels; bleeding
 7. Condition with sudden onset caused by acute vascular lesions of the brain; often followed by permanent neurologic damage (stroke or brain attack)
 11. Artificial substitution of heart and lung action indicated for cardiac arrest or apparent sudden death resulting from electric shock, drowning, respiratory arrest, and other causes (CPR)
 13. Separation of the layers of a surgical wound; maybe partial, superficial only, or complete, with disruption of all layers

15. condition of profound hemodynamic and metabolic disturbance characterized by failure of the circulatory system to maintain adequate perfusion of vital organs
 16. Unpleasant sensation, vaguely referred to the epigastrium and abdomen and often culminating in vomiting
 17. Forcible expulsion of the contents of the stomach through the mouth
 18. Unexpected or sudden occasion; an urgent or pressing need

1. Vascular reaction, usually transient, involving the upper dermis, representing localized edema caused by dilatation and increased permeability of the capillaries and marked by the development of wheels; also called hives

3. Disorganized cardiac rhythm
 6. Abnormal drowsiness or stupor; a condition of indifference
 8. Paleness, absence of skin coloration
 9. Illusion of movement; sensation as if the external world were revolving around the patients or as if the patient were revolving in space
 10. Bodily injuries caused by physical means with disruption of the normal continuity of structures
 12. Temporary suspension of consciousness as a result of generalized cerebral ischemia; faint or swoon
 14. Nosebleed, hemorrhage from the nose
