| 2. They provide inpatient continuity of care for clients with persistent, recurring diseases or complex medical conditions that require long-term stays (often over a month) in an acute care environment. | B. Specialty Hospitals |
| 3. They are facilities that generally engage in geriatric care—care for elderly people needing nursing services and assistance with personal care and daily living activities. | C. State university med center |
| 4. They offer older individuals the opportunity to remain independent in a home of their own that's typically located on a campus with health care professionals on staff and facilities/activities designed specifically for older individuals. | D. Independent living centers |
| 5. They provide care that promotes wellness and diagnosis of illness. | E. Emergency care |
| 6. They provide outpatient care for clients who require physical or occupational therapy, recreational therapy, hydrotherapy, and other therapies (such as speech or hearing therapy) for loss of function in mobility or the activities of daily living. | F. Hospice |
