

2. the part of the body of a mammal between the neck and the abdomen, including the cavity enclosed by the ribs, breastbone, and dorsal vertebrae, and containing the chief organs of circulation and respiration; the chest.
3. technical term for shoulder blade
6. the treatment of disease, injury, or deformity by physical methods such as massage, heat treatment, and exercise rather than by drugs or surgery
10. technical term for club foot.
12. a triangular bone in the lower back formed from fused vertebrae and situated between the two hipbones of the pelvis
13. an electromagnetic wave of high energy and very short wavelength, which is able to pass through many materials opaque to light

14. the inner and typically larger of the two bones between the knee and the ankle (or the equivalent joints in other terrestrial vertebrates), parallel with the fibula.

15. the surgical cutting of a tendon, especially as a remedy for club foot

18. wrench or twist the ligaments of (an ankle, wrist, or other joint) violently so as to cause pain and swelling but not dislocation

19. a framework of bone or cartilage enclosing the brain of a vertebrate; the skeleton of a person's or animal's head.

20. a thickened ventral plate on each segment of the body of an arthropod

1. a groove or furrow, especially one on the surface of the brain.

4. a stitch or row of stitches holding together the edges of a wound or surgical incision

5. a rib that is attached directly to the breastbone

7. a bone of the tarsus.

8. a cavity within a bone or other tissue, especially one in the bones of the face or skull connecting with the nasal cavities.

9. the thinner and longer of the two bones in the human forearm, on the side opposite to the thumb

11. the thicker and shorter of the two bones in the human forearm

16. a flexible but inelastic cord of strong fibrous collagen tissue attaching a muscle to a bone.

17. a strip of rigid material used for supporting and immobilizing a broken bone when it has been set
