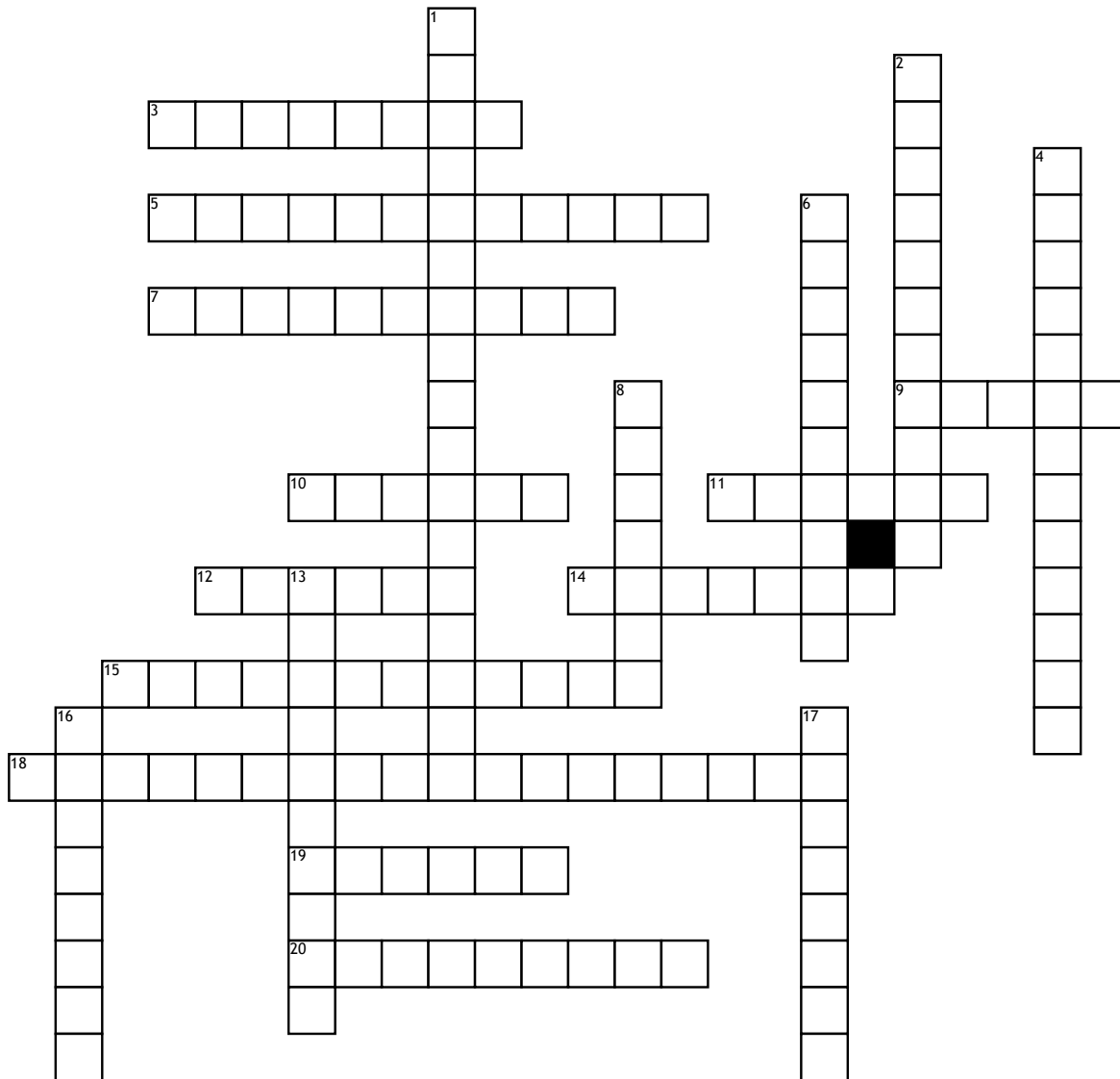

3. the action of drawing or pulling a thing over a surface, especially a road or track.

5. either of a pair of bones that form part of the side of the skull on each side and enclose the middle and inner ear.

7. inflammation of a tendon, most commonly from overuse but also from infection or rheumatic disease.

9. the inner and typically larger of the two bones between the knee and the ankle (or the equivalent joints in other terrestrial vertebrates), parallel with the fibula.

10. the part of the body of a mammal between the neck and the abdomen, including the cavity enclosed by the ribs, breastbone, and dorsal vertebrae, and containing the chief organs of circulation and respiration; the chest.

11. a flexible but inelastic cord of strong fibrous collagen tissue attaching a muscle to a bone.

12. a stitch or row of stitches holding together the edges of a wound or surgical incision.

14. technical term for club foot.

15. an immovably fixed joint between bones connected by fibrous tissue

18. is when the fracture line is perpendicular to the shaft (long part) of the bone.

19. a groove or furrow, especially one on the surface of the brain.

20. a nodule or small eminence, especially one on a bone, for attachment of a tendon; see also tuber and tuberosity.

1. each of the twelve bones of the backbone to which the ribs are attached.

2. an incomplete or partial dislocation of a joint or organ. The exact definition depends on the anatomical part being involved.

4. joins bones with a fibrous joint capsule that is continuous with the periosteum of the joined bones, constitutes the outer boundary of a synovial cavity, and surrounds the bones' articulating surfaces.

6. any of two bony protuberances by which muscles are attached to the upper part of the thigh bone.

8. a bone of the tarsus.

16. a rib that is attached directly to the breastbone.

17. the surgical cutting of a tendon, especially as a remedy for club foot.
