

- **3.** 18th-century intellectual movement that emphasized the use of reason and the scientific method as means of obtaining knowledge
- 5. English policy of relaxing the enforcement of regulations in its colonies in return for the colonies continued economic loyalty
- **6.** Voyage that brought enslaved Africans to West Indies and later to North America
- 7. Order in which Britain prohibited its American colonists from settling west of the Appalachian mountains
- **10.** Transatlantic system of trade in which goods and people including slaves, were exchanged between Africa, England, Europe, the West Indies, and the colonies in North America
