


# Chapter 3 Colonies Come of Age

 4. An order in which Britain prohibited its American colonists from settling west of the Appalachian Mountains  
 6. A trade law enacted by Parliament in 1764 in an attempt to reduce smuggling in the British colonies in North America

 11. An economic system in which nations seek to increase their wealth and power by obtaining large amounts of gold and silver and by establishing a favorable balance of trade.  
 12. An 18th-century intellectual movement that emphasized the use of reason and the scientific method as means of obtaining knowledge.

13. The transatlantic system of trade in which goods and people, including slaves, were exchanged between Africa, England, Europe, the West Indies, and the colonies in North America  
 14. A 1739 uprising of slaves in South Carolina, leading to the tightening of already harsh slave laws  
 15. A series of laws enacted by Parliament, beginning of 1651, to tighten England's control of trade in its American colonies.

2. The transfer of the British monarchy from James II to William and Mary in 1688-1689

3. A conflict in North America, lasting from 1754 to 1763, that was part of a worldwide struggle between France and Britain and that ended with the defeat of France and the transfer to French Canada to Britain  
 5. The voyage that brought enslaved Africans to the West Indies and later to North America.  
 7. An English policy of relaxing the enforcement of regulations in its colonies in return for the colonies continued economic loyalty

 10. A revival of religious feeling in the American colonies during the 1730's to and 1750's
