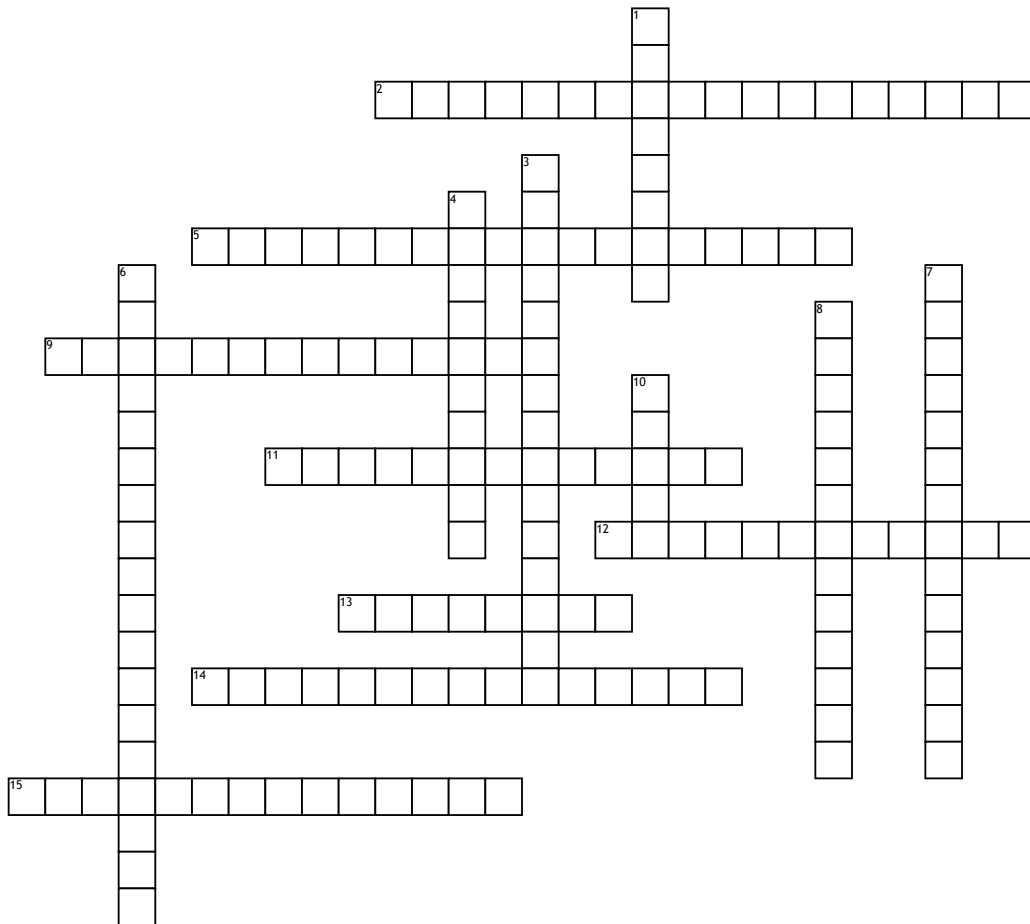


# Chapter 3 Colonies come of Age
