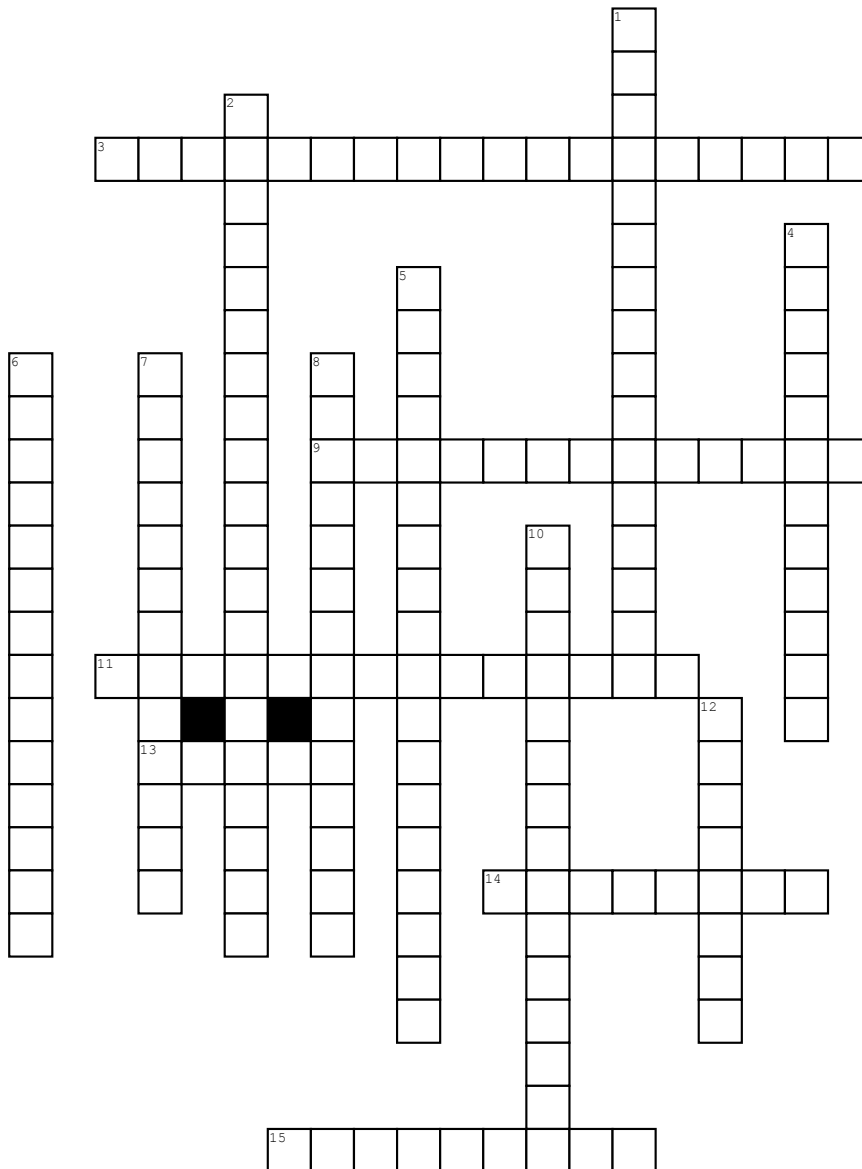

8. A revival of religious feelings in the American colonies during the 1730s and 1750s.
10. The transatlantic system in which goods and people were exchanged between Africa, England, Europe, and the West Indies.
