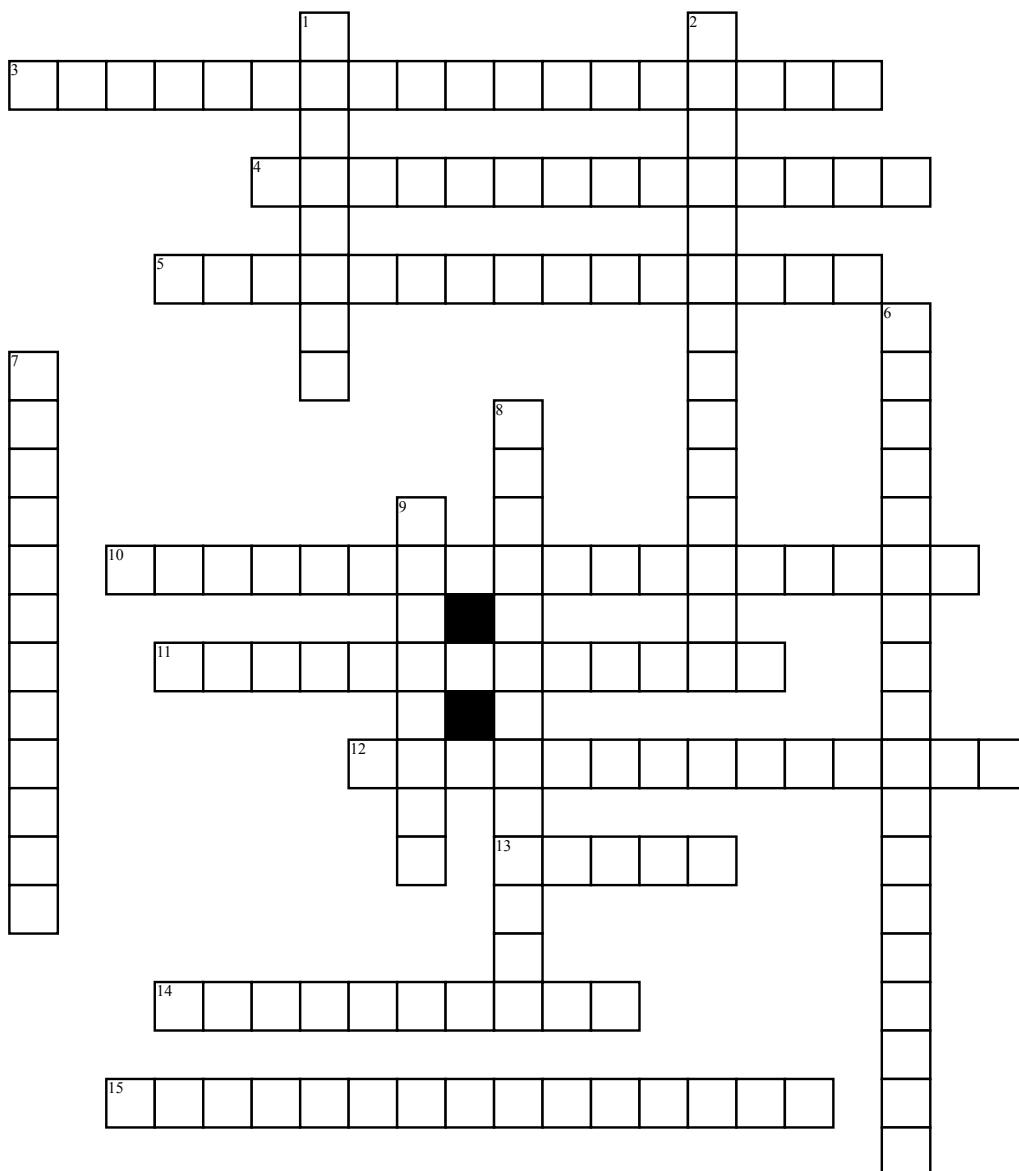


# Chapter 3: The colonies Come of Age
